CAPE CHARLES: Reports of Red Drum on the Barrier Islands. Using peeler crabs and cut Bunker. Flounder fishing has been good on the bayside at buoy 36A.

VIRGINIA BEACH: Rudee and Lynnhaven Inlets have reports of bluefish, with a few specks and puppy drum.

LITTLE CREEK: Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnel had reports of near keeper flounder and gray trout. Willoughby Jetty also with gray trout.

VIRGINIA SEAFOOD GUMBO

1 ½ tablespoon Cooking oil

1 cup Chopped onion

1 cup Chopped green pepper

2 cloves Garlic, minced

2 cups Beef broth

1 16 oz. can Tomatoes

or

2 cups Fresh tomatoes, chopped

½ teaspoon Salt

½ teaspoon Thyme

½ teaspoon Red pepper

Bluefish, Catfish or Striped bass fillet

1 cup Okra







Palomar Knot

Palomar Knots provide another very simple knot for terminal tackle. It is considered to be the strongest knot for this application. It can be tied in the dark with a minimum of practice.

- Double about 10 inches of line, and pass through the eye.
- Tie an Overhand Knot in the doubled line, letting the hook hang loose. Avoid twisting the lines.
- Pull the end of loop down, passing it completely over the hook,
- 4. Pull both ends of the line to draw up the knot.
