

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR BOATERS

The Coast Guard in Hampton Roads has a new emergency number for mariners who can't use a radio channel, the primary method of communication.

Any mariner unable to use Marine VHF Radio Channel 16 (156.8 MHz) may now call a new toll-free emergency number: 1-877-SCCJSAR (1-877-722-5727).

Sector Hampton Roads, which will take calls from that emergency number, is responsible for responding to marine emergencies along the coast from the Delaware-Maryland border to the Virginia-North Carolina border, in the Chesapeake Bay south of the Potmoac River and within Virginia's navigable rivers.




