# FISH TALES

# VBAC Members were out in numbers this past month hitting the waters and catching some fish...

# Kevin Meyer tells us.....

Sunday 10 April was a great day to get out on the water, So Bob Stuhlman, Jerry Mariano and I went out to the Chick and James river to fish for some whiskerfish.

I went out Saturday evening an caught about 30 Gizzard Shad in the Cast net and cut some up and vacuume sealed it for our bait today and put some in the freezer for later

We get out on Gordon Creek about 8 am and head to one of the Cat holes I know on the james river and set up but we didnt get any bites for a while so we moved about 30 yards and Immediatley caught a couple of eater sized fish, Then Jerry gets a nice 13 lber in the cooler and then the bite stopped. We were checked by VMP while at the first stop, two officers in a police boat pulled along side and I guess they were just checking boat numbers they didnt say anything and then they just waved and took off.

we decided to move up river and set up in another area and we caught a few more eaters and Bob gets a bohemouth 37 lb 39 inch beast in the boat!!!, CPR and high fives all around and then another VMP officer stops and checks licenses, life jackets, asks about our fish and was on his way...Very polite Officer I must Say.

We moved into a creek when the tide died and caught a few more eaters, and moved to a deep water corner and one of the rear rods goes off and its a good fish!! he gets three lines tangled into a knarly mess but I did get him in the boat!! 41.21 Lbs and 42 inches long, (photo Below) Again CPR, and we went back towards the launch ramp and set up for about 30 minutes. No bites but Game wardens pulled up along side and started asking about our catch and we had to clear a couple of lines as they approached, I told them they were the third ones to check us today and they seemed surprised and asked where and when, We told them and they asked to see our fish and they said OK we wont bother you again, since you have already been checked. They left and we called it a day. we loaded up and headed home got stuck at the HRBT for over an hour due to an accident. this is my Second Best catfish ever!! It was a good Day on the water even though we all got sun/ wind burned today!! Thanks for coming along today guys it was fun.





# When Fishing is light—we offer Tips from our members:

Here are some tips from Melanie Bayford: (Russell, you may want to pay attention)

The most important tip that I can pass on for fishing is to not have stuff like Suntan lotion or Gas or Oil or any other smelly chemical substances on your hands. Fish can smell the smallest amount of foreign substances on your bait. I have informed Don that I no longer will put onions on his sandwiches since he outfished me the last time I did that. I could smell the onion on my hands even after handling bait. We put our suntan lotion on in the morning before we leave the house and scrub our hands thoroughly. If we have to add any lotion during the day, I will usually put it on both of us and rub squid on my hands and wash them thoroughly. Then throw the squid away, AND I have Don bait my hooks until I feel that the lotion smell is gone.

I would also like to share our tips for seasickness cures. Don and I both get seasick. The best cure that we have found is Bonine. It is not as drowsy as dramamine. If we are going out with someone else and the weather is iffy, we will take a Bonine at bedtime, then another in the morning. Don usually takes another at noon to be sure. We always make sure that we have enough rigs tied for the next day ahead of time. If we have to tie a rig or undo a knot, we hold it at eye level. Looking down is a no-no if you can avoid it. Also, stay out of the cabin. If you are anchored, the stern is the place to be. Bonine can be purchased in bottles of 100 pills for a much lower price if you want to put up with some grief. (We use that much) I go to Wal-Mart to the pharmacy counter and ask for the 100 pill bottle of Meclezine. They will try to tell you they can't sell it to you that way, but it is not a prescription item. Just be firm but polite.

For those of you with a small boat and a snap-on gas line, I recommend carrying an extra snap-on connection to your motor. I have had two occasions where gasahol has eaten the seal around the ball in the snap on connection. Luckily, the first time, I was only a mile from the dock and was able to get back by having my passenger force fuel into the motor by continually pressurizing the line. The night before that trip, Don and I had gone 8 miles downriver and 8 miles back in the dark. Glad it did not happen then. The second time, I had an extra connection on board. Quick change and on my way.

# **FYI- Back Bay Fishing**

The US Fish and Wildlife Service today announced the start of a limited night surf fishing program at BBNWR.

Night surf fishing will be permitted along the Refuge beach daily until midnight during the month of October, with the exception of four scheduled hunt days. Fishing will be allowed by special use permit only, on a 1500 foot long stretch of beach in the northern part of the Refuge. Permits will be issued starting in early September from the Refuge Headquarters at 1324 Sandbridge Road and will cost \$35.00. No permit is required fro daytime surf fishing. # **Legislative Alert**

Alexandria, VA – The Commission's Atlantic Striped Bass Management Board has initiated development of Draft Addendum III with the goals of reducing striped bass fishing mortality (F) up to 40% and further protecting spawning stock when it is concentrated and vulnerable. The addendum was initiated in order to allow managers to promptly respond to the results of the stock assessment update in the fall if necessary. Provisions of the addendum, if passed, could be implemented prior to the start of the 2012 fishing year.

The Board's action responds to recent trends in the fishery and resource, including a 66% decline in estimated recreational catch from 2006 to 2009; a 25% decline in estimated striped bass abundance from 2004 to 2008; and lowered recruitment in recent years. Additionally, states in the northern extent of the fishery have expressed concern over decreased availability of striped bass as a result of the diminished water quality in the Chesapeake Bay during the summer months that may also contribute to increased prevalence of mycobacteriosis in striped bass.

Draft Addendum III will propose a range of fishing management measures including, but not limited to, adjustments to commercial and recreational minimum size (for jurisdictions outside Chesapeake Bay and Albemarle Sound/Roanoke River), reductions in annual coastal commercial allocation, reductions in recreational bag limits, revisions to the target F rate (for Chesapeake Bay and Albemarle Sound/Roanoke River), and reductions on fishing for striped bass in known spawning areas during the spawning season by at least 50% (for jurisdictions bordering the Hudson River, Delaware River, Chesapeake Bay and Albemarle Sound/Roanoke River).

The commercial and recreational fishery is currently managed through Amendment 6 to the Striped Bass Fishery Management Plan. The Amendment, passed in 2003, allocates the coastal commercial quota and set a two fish bag limit and a 28 inch size minimum for the recreational fishery, with the exception of the Chesapeake Bay fisheries, Albemarle Sound/Roanoke River fisheries, and states with approved alternative regulations.




