The temperature continued to climb, no breeze could be found, but the 10 club members who participated stuck it out for two hours. The area looked fantastic when completed. The Virginia Beach boat ramp attendants greatly appreciate our club taking an active role in keeping the boat ramp clean.

For background on ADOPT-A-SPOT, our Club has been granted an ADOPT-A-SPOT/WATERWAY on the Lynnhaven Inlet and Chesapeake Bay at Crab Creek Boat Ramp/Lynnhaven Beach in Virginia Beach. We signed up to perform a clean-up of the beach area at the Crab Creek Boat Ramp beginning back in January 2011. Last year's clean-ups were supported by a number of our members, with very clean results at the Creek.

Our commitment to this worthy endeavor requires that we conduct 6 clean-ups per year. The scheduled clean-ups for 2012 will take place the Saturday following our monthly meeting of January, March, May, July, September, and November. We anticipate meeting in the parking lot at Crab Creek by 10:00 am Saturday mornings to begin our session. The club will serve a lunch to our volunteers at each session.

Congrats Beth

On behalf of VBAC, I would like to recognize one of our member's achievements and new appointment. Beth Synowiec of Virginia Beach has recently been appointed to serve on the Virginia Marine Resource Commission's (VMRC) FinFish Management Advisory Committee (FMAC). Beth was first recognized about 7 years ago in the fishing community under her boat name Classicrockfish in which she began to write about her fishing journeys on the water under various fishing forums. She has since helped many anglers who wish to learn her different methods that she uses to catch fish. She also is pro-active about sending samples of fish to the VMRC collection program for additional species research and was complimented for the work that she provided towards the Grouper Tilefish meeting a couple of years ago. Originally she was a member of the Portsmouth Anglers Club and she later joined the VBAC serving as the treasurer for a year. She has been awarded the VBAC top female angler 4 years in row and has been Virginia expert angler for 2 years in a row. She is also a member of the Norfolk Anglers Club (NAC) and received the angler of the year award for 2010 as well as top female angler of the year award that same year for the NAC. In 2010 she landed 12 citations in 8 different species, as a result of this, the NAC President verbally suggested that females be viewed as direct competition to the rest of the club. The NAC board voted on it and thus completely removed the separate "female angler category;" therefore, that category no longer exists in their club awards. The following year, Beth was awarded release angler of the year for both clubs. Her passion for recreational fishing has been viewed by many as contagious. Beth Synowiec is now the first woman in the state of Virginia to hold a seat on the VMRC's Finfish Management Advisory Committee. Way to go Beth; we're proud of you, Butch Eason

This will help to more accurately weigh the catch and effort data we receive from the fishing surveyors at the boat ramps. After you get to the website by clinking the lin and selecting the appropriate form, a pdf with MANY pages will pop up. Save the pdf to the desktop on your computer, then scroll through the document and enter info into the appropriate sites. Save the completed file on the computer, then send the completed pdf file as an email attachment to the VMRC (follow their instructions). Alternatively, anglers could print out only the pages they wanted to answer, then postal mail that to the VMRC when done.

VBAC Member Info
