For background on ADOPT-A-SPOT, our Club has been granted an ADOPT-A-SPOT/ WATERWAY on the Lynnhaven Inlet and Chesapeake Bay at Crab Creek Boat Ramp/ Lynnhaven Beach in Virginia Beach. We signed up to perform a clean-up of the beach area at the Crab Creek Boat Ramp beginning back in January 2011. Last year's clean-ups were supported by a number of our members, with very clean results at the Creek.

Our commitment to this worthy endeavor requires that we conduct 6 clean-ups per year. Changes to Club Prize Fish Minimums

We've made some changes to club minimums (effective immediately) for fresh and saltwater prize fish. Also, remember that all fish must be caught in accordance with state and federal regulations (e.g. Shad above the Fall Line and Striped Bass outside 3 miles are both no-no's).

The 2012 Virginia Charter Boat Workshop will be held at the Virginia Institute of Marine Science (Watermen's Hall) on Saturday, March 10, 2012. Hours: 8AM to 4PM.

The workshop will focus on charter business management with sessions on fisheries management, legal issues, insurance needs, marketing and finance tips and lessons learned from current charter operators.

The workshop is open to all charter and head boat operators and marina professionals.

"Hunt for the Hardheads" Fishing Challenge

A croaker, bluefish, and flounder fishing challenge between the Great Bridge Fisherman's Association, Portsmouth Anglers Club, and the Virginia Beach Anglers Club will be held on Saturday, May 12, 2012 at the Willoughby Public Boat Ramp (13th View St. and Bayville St. Norfolk, VA). Lines in at 7AM and 'measure in' is between 12:30 and 1:30PM. Entry Fee: \$30.00 / Boat (3 angler teams). Additional Anglers \$10.00. Includes: Fishing, Picnic and Wish A Fish Donation (Picnic only is \$5). RULES:

- 1. Club may enter as many teams as they would like. Team Captains must be club members.
- 2. Teams must register and pay in advance through their own club's tournament director.
- 3. Boats may depart from any VA port.
- 4. The eastern boundary will be 500 yards east of the HRBT.
- 5. Fish will be measured by length only, if the exact length is encountered a girth measurement will decide.
- 6. Points Structure... The longest legal fish of each species will earn 5 points, the 2nd longest legal earns 4 pts, 3rd longest legal fish earns 3 pts, 4th longest legal fish earns 2pts., and the 5th longest legal fish earns 1pt.
- 7. The Club with the Most Points Wins!

2012 Flounder Regs Info

The Virginia Marine Resources Commission (VMRC) is voting on four flounder regulations for the 2012 season, one of which will be chosen after input from area fisherman and clubs. The proposed regulations are: A) 17 1/2 inch minimum size limit, 5 fish possession limit, and no closed season; B) 17 inch minimum size limit, 5 fish possession limit, and no closed season; C) 17 inch minimum size limit, 4 fish possession limit, and no closed season; and D) 16 1/2 inch minimum size limit, 4 fish possession limit, and no closed season. The VBAC Board agreed on option B which I have submitted to the VMRC. VMRC will vote on Tuesday, 2/28/12. Submitted by, Butch Eason

As I understand it, Virginia would still have to abide by the ASMFC's regulations on coastal marine resources (including Menhaden) whether the state is part of the ASMFC or not ... but Virginia wouldn't have a seat at the table (vote).


Fish Recipe




