

Great job George and Treat. Congratulations!







Coast Guard Vessel Safety Inspections

Coast Guard vessel safety inspections are available to the public for free. The process is very simple and they meet you anywhere that is convenient for you. They will meet you at a house, boat ramp, or marina... Wherever your boat is stored.

Fill in the form provided and submit, and a Vessel Examiner nearest to your zip-code will call you or email you to set up a vessel exam in your driveway, at a boat ramp, or in a marina, wherever you have your boat. It does not need to be in the water to be examined.

Boater Safety Requirement

In 2007, the Virginia General Assembly enacted a law to establish a <u>boating safety education compliance</u> <u>requirement</u>. This requirement was phased in over the last several years and on July 1, 2016, all operators of PWCs (Personal Watercraft such as jet skis, Sea Dos, Wave Runners) and operators of Motorboats with a 10 hp or greater motor, will be required to have a boating safety education course completion card on board when operating a PWC or Motorboat.



As of July 1, 2015, all PWC operators age 14 and older and motorboat operators 50 and younger must complete a boating safety course. Beginning July 1, 2016, all PWC operators age 14 and older and all motorboat operators regardless of age need to take a boating safety course.

PWC Age Restriction: No person under the age of 14 may operate a PWC. Those operators 14 and 15 MUST show proof of completing an approved and accepted boating safety course either in a classroom or online. The challenge exam or other provisions of the Education Compliance Requirement do not meet the requirements of the age restriction law.

It has been many years but I've been working hard to pay back my dad for all the recent trips he hasn't caught one. It turned out to be a very special Father's Day with no expectations of how the day might have played out. 
catching a cobia so much. Best to all the members! - Rob Stommel





Fun Afternoon Trip

Rob Stommel and myself went out in the 2nd week of June to get in on the early season action. We fished close to the bridge expecting plenty of small fish. We fought many smaller sharks and a ton of large Cow Nose Rays. They were by far the biggest I had ever see them, some of them weight well over 100 pounds with 4-5 foot wingspans. It was a challenge just to get them close enough to the boat to cut the leader. We did end up hooking this nice cobia as my first of the season. This nice little 42 inch fish made a great dinner. The weather has been good on the days I have had off and have been on the water enough to know what time the currents are turning over. The key this year for me has been my live baits. Make sure



Four Play

I took out fellow Virginia Beach Anglers Club members Jerry Hughes and Victor Minak on June 30th to try and top my dad's biggest for the month. Because of the time the tide turned, we decided to meet at the dock around 10:30. After catching bait, we set up on the fishing grounds around 12:00 in the afternoon. There was a pretty good outbound current but it had just started slacking. About a dozen sharks into the setup, I was having a difficult time keeping more than 2 or 3 lines wet at a time. Jerry's first cobia (43") grabbed one of the live baits. Before we could even get this fish into the boat, a second fish hits and runs away from the boat. Victor's fish, nearly 100 yards out, was easy to identify as a big cobia when it first surfaced. After a short time playing with it and a near miss with the chum bucket, we had two cobia on the deck without even putting the second fish away. Victor's fish measured 52 inches. Over the next 30 minutes, we had 2 more cobia on and were both boated, but shorter than the first two (37" and 42"). 90 minutes on the water and 4 cobia is a pretty good ratio. We stayed long enough to use the rest of the live

baits but no more takers. When we returned to the dock, it was easy to tell we had two male fish after weighing them. Both were lighter than normal for their lengths. The smaller weighed in at 24# and the larger at 36#. I later learned that the sight fishing boat near me was Captain Austin Hayne, and he had pulled a 58# female out of the tail end of my chum slick and at about the same time that we were catching ours. It is likely the fish that the two larger males we caught were following. Another great day on the water. -Kelly Hoggard



Dr. Ike went fishing for cobia with Russell Willoughby and Jerry Hughes on Wednesday, 6/29 in Russell's 21 foot Mako. The day began early as we were trying to make the beginning of the turnover from incoming to outgoing currents but mechanical complications on the boat had us out at the 9ft shoal area bayside right after the current turned. It was choppy with winds NW 10-12 mph most of the day which made it tricky to

keep from being thrown out of the boat at times. We had chum bags out on top and bottom and proceeded to catch one shark, cownose ray or clearnose skate after another for hours. Finally, as the current started to slow down, my rod went off and I started fighting what I at first thought was a shark with it making a fast long run. Then it made a lot of head shakes until I got it closer to the boat when we could finally see it was a cobia, my first this year. When he saw the boat, he made another strong run and started to circle the boat. We managed to keep him from crossing out other lines which was amazing considering he went around us a couple of times before I was able to get him



near enough for Jerry to net him. This cobia measured out 43 inches and 28.5 lbs. A nice size fish to eat. Unfortunately, this cobia was the only one we caught or hooked up for the day. We stayed until about an hour after the incoming tide started and didn't get anything but critters. Nevertheless, we made several meals out of this fish. Blessings. -Dr Ike.

Fishing Reports

Three Shellcrackers Citations in Lake Prince



Citation shell crackers (aka sunfish) that I caught on Russell Willoughby's boat with him at Lake Prince are in the pic. The one on the right was 2 lb. 4 oz., and the one on the left was 1 lb. 14 oz. but obviously longer. Russell had caught a 1 lb. 4 oz. shell cracker early in the day but unfortunately we didn't get a pic of it. Those that I caught were at the last stop of the day around 3:00 pm. Russell's was caught at the first stop of the day around 8:00 am. Otherwise it was all small shell crackers and bluegills throughout the day. I did catch one bluegill that weighed 12 oz. at Ocean's East Bait and Tackle

where we weighed all the fish. It was a hot day but nice breeze most of the day. We decided to stop in the shade for the last casts to stay out of the sun and as soon as my bait hit the bottom the 1 lb. 14 oz. shell cracker was on. At first I thought it was a catfish or striper as it gave me a fit trying to get it to the surface. But as soon as it got to the surface we knew it was a shell cracker. I netted it and after unhooking, weighing it and taking a picture I thought maybe there are more and put the baited jig back in the same place so I put my bait down again in the same place and instantly I had the bigger one on. Again my ultralight rig was almost completely bent over as I fought it to the surface. While this 2 lb. 4 oz. fish was shorter it was obviously fatter girth wise, likely a female. I still can't believe how big they were, since I've never seen shell crackers so big. Both were caught on red wigglers on a naked jig using my ultralight spinning rig Shimano rod/Abu Garcia reel. In all this was another great day of fishing the lake with Russell. If I don't watch it he'll start charging me charter fees. LOL. Blessings. -Dr. Ike

Red Drum Frenzy

I went fishing with Henry Troutner and wife Mary on their boat along with Russell Willoughby and Ned Smith to the Nautilus Shoals area near Fisherman's Island for red drum yesterday. Fishing began around 3:30 using blue crab halves and in no time Henry and I picked up a couple of fish on the incoming current. Henry Troutner's first drum was caught on his Penn Battle 4000 rig which with only 20 pound line so he had to fight the fish for 20 minutes to get it to the net. But after those two no bites were had other than Mary's fighting a southern ray until around 8:30 when the current shifted to outgoing and then the bite was on! All four rods when down and we had a fishing frenzy going on. Ned and Russell and Mary each brought a fish to the boat but mine wrapped around the rudder and I had to cut the line. But shortly after re-rigging I had another one on, a 45 inch one, the biggest of the night. I ended up with hooking one more but that one pulled the hook after a few minutes. In all 8 red drum between 40-45 inch long were caught by us and release healthy and we left them still biting. It was a wild finish to a great trip. Blessings. -Dr. Ike
