Fishing was a little tougher than usual. Teams had to make do with the occasional roundhead and bluefish bite. The contest requires the fish to be weighed on a certified scale. A photo and short story or caption are required as part of the contest rules. There is no minimum size limit except for the fish to meet state regulation requirements (i.e. No flounder less than 16 inches). Fill in the form provided and submit, and a Vessel Examiner nearest to your zip-code will call you or email you to set up a vessel exam in your driveway, at a boat ramp, or in a marina, wherever you have your boat. It does not need to be in the water to be examined.

Boater Safety Requirement

In 2007, the Virginia General Assembly enacted a law to establish a <u>boating safety education compliance</u> requirement. This requirement was phased in over the last several years and on July 1, 2016, all operators of PWCs (Personal Watercraft such as jet skis, Sea Doos, Wave Runners) and operators of Motorboats with a 10 hp or greater motor, will be required to have a boating safety education course completion card on board when operating a PWC or Motorboat.

As of July 1, 2015, all PWC operators age 14 and older and motorboat operators 50 and younger must complete a boating safety course. Beginning July 1, 2016, all PWC operators age 14 and older and all motorboat operators regardless of age need to take a boating safety course.

PWC Age Restriction: No person under the age of 14 may operate a PWC. Those operators 14 and 15 MUST show proof of completing an approved and accepted boating safety course either in a classroom or online. The challenge exam or other provisions of the Education Compliance Requirement do not meet the requirements of the age restriction law.

COBIA CLASSIC TOURNAMENT RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The deadline for registration is Friday, June 17, 2016 @ 7:30P.M.
- 2. The Virginia Beach Angler's Club reserves the right to refuse entry to any angler or vessel.
- 3. The Entry Fee is \$100.00 per boat if paid by June 11, 2016, thereafter the fee is \$125.00.
- 4. The Tournament Committee advises all participants to attend the Captains meeting to insure they are aware of any rule changes or clarifications.
- 5. At the Captains meeting, the Tournament Committee will decide if Saturday is fishable. If Saturday is declared not fishable, the tournament will be rescheduled for Sunday.
- 6. Each boat entered in the Tournament will be eligible for only one prize.
- 7. The Tournament Committee reserves the right to inspect all boats entered in the competition.
- 8. A boat may not be replaced after the entry deadline, unless broken down. A tournament official must be notified on the change before "lines in."
- 9. All fish must be caught on hook and line.
- 10. Fish shall not be mutilated in any way other than hook and gaff marks.
- 11. Two or more boats congregating close enough to pass fish may be disqualified from the tournament.
- 12. Scales will be open from 3:00P.M. to 5:00 P.M. All fish must be weighed by the official VBAC Tournament Weighmaster.
- 13. All fish must be weighed in at the Tournament Headquarters not later than 5:00P.M.
- 14. Fish will be checked for freshness and are subject to inspection of stomach contents.
- 15. All protests must be submitted no later than 30 minutes after the weighing of the last fish.
- 16. Prizes will be awarded @ 5:30P.M. at Tournament Headquarters, Long Bay Pointe Marina.
- 17. Prizes are awarded solely on the basis of fish weight. In the event of identical weights, the first fish weighed in will be declared the winner.
- 18. Winning anglers may be requested to submit to and successfully pass a polygraph test prior to being presented any prize.
- 19. Boat registrant must be present and positive identification is required for all prizes.
- 20. All fish weighed must meet the requirements according to Virginia Regulations.

The following statement must be read, signed and turned in with the entry form.

"I understand that as Tournament Captain, participant, or boat owner, I am responsible for my boat and occupants at all times. I have read and fully understand and agree to abide by the rules of the Virginia Beach Angler's Club Cobia Classic. I hereby release The Virginia Beach Angler's Club, Long Bay Pointe Marina, and their affiliates from any and all liability. I further understand that the decision to fish and participate in the Tournament is the responsibility of the registrant, Captain or boat owner.

Fishing Reports Monthly Club Competition – Tautog

April 18: Russell Willoughby caught a tog while fishing the 2nd Island with blue crabs. It was a slow day of fishing but Managed to pull in this keeper. It was **3 pounds 9 ounces.**

April 25: I (Kelly Hoggard) went tog fishing on Monday, April 25th with Ike Eisenhower and Bob Stuhlman. Was planning to take the big boat offshore but the alternator froze up when I tried to start it the week before. Alternate plan was to take the Shelby Kat II out and we fished the bridge tunnel. Left Crab Creek around 7:30. Seas were nice with a swell from the north east and a light breeze from the south - south west. Fished the 2nd Island until the tide turned at 9:00. There were about 4 boats and no signs of any action from anyone. Left there to fish somewhere else but another boat took our spot, so we continued on. Fished the 3rd island for a couple of hours. There were a few togs caught by a boat near the rouge rock, but with about 6 boats fishing the rocks, there was a lot of competition. We got into some nice oyster toads but didn't quite fit our appetites. After the current picked up,



we tried to move over to the pilings on the 3rd but the waves were a little aggressive there, ended up on the back side of the 4th with some nice structure on one set. No luck on a couple different sets of pilings. After punishing ourselves with the crossing wind and waves, moved over the 4th island rocks since there was no traffic. Fished the tide turn at about 2:00 but no bites of any kind there. Southwest wind picked up by then and was blowing pretty good around 15kts. Fished with fiddlers and blue crab all day. Our togs weighed a grand total of **0 pounds and 0 ounces.** It was my first day on the water all year. I was eager just to be out and we had a good time together. Drum season is around the corner and looking forward to going out again soon. Catches have already been reported and the boat is ready to go!



Fishing Reports Monthly Club Competition – Tautog



April 25: Kevin and Beth Synowiec - Noticed a weather window of at least 4 to 5 hours before wind was supposed to kick up so we headed out to an offshore wreck. Gorgeous day spent with my 'partner in crime' Kevin and the Tautog bite was great! We quickly managed limit and then we just kept releasing lost count after 17 plus fish. Kevin's rod went off and the expression on his face was absolutely priceless when this beast hit the deck. This was definitely his biggest tog to date. My rod went off... with a nice biggin too about 25 minutes later & I was stoked to see that big white chin hit the deck. Short, sweet, and to the point trip which is exactly what we both needed after having our boat down for as long as we did... Left location to head back at 12:45 and glad we did because the wind did crank up as predicted up to sw 27 knot winds on the way back. Fish bit mostly on blue crab , and they didn't seem to care about the fiddlers or clams when offered. **Tautog weights 19 lb 6oz and 13 lb 8 oz**. Feels great to be back on the water finally!!!

April 11: Reese Bowles and Steve Harding had a 'crappie' day of fishing. Went out on Steve Harding's 'crappie' little boat. The two of them must have looked like a giant spider on the lake. They had ten 25 foot long crappie rods with light 'crappie' bobbers and a small 'crappie' jig. The jigs Reese was using were tipped with a medium 'crappie' shiner. They caught and released 6 chain pickerel, 4 racoon perch, 2 blue gill, and some smaller crappie. Had a nice mess of keepers. Reese learned a lot about the 'crappie' setup. Reese is appreciative of his time on the water with Steve and learning all the fishing tips and tricks.



April 23: via Mike Anderson – My neighbors niece/nephew (age 4 &5) came over the other weekend and wanted to go fishing. My neighbors told the kids that they did not have a pole.
