Hatteras Village Surf Fishing Tournament - September 8th/9th/10th

VBAC sent two teams to the 33rd Annual Hatteras Village Civic Association Invitational Surf Fishing Tournament. The tournament was held September 8, 9, &10, 2016. The weather was great and the fishing was better than in a lot of years. There were a lot of fish caught and by far most of the scoring fish were bluefish. A total of 64 teams participated in the Tournament. Team 'A' finished in 17th place, tied with 4 other teams, with 37 points. Team 'B' finished in 18th place with 34 points. The SCABS from VB won the tournament with 133 points. Team 'B' must have caught 30 or 40 puppy drum between 14 inches and 17 inches but could not catch a scoring fish. Returning from Team 'A' are: David Reynolds with 6 fish for 13 points, Robbie Parks 5/9, and Jerry Hughes 4/9. Returning from Team 'B' are: Steve Wray with 8 fish for 16 points, Mark Wray 5/9 and Cheryl Johnson 5/7. Both teams represented the club well finishing in the top third of the field. Long Beach Island Surf Fishing Tournament - September 24th

This is the 5th year VBAC has sent teams to fish in the Long Beach Island Fishing Club's Surf Fishing Tournament. In these 5 years we have fielded 9 teams (only one team in 2015). There are usually 45 to 50 teams in this tournament, and we usually finish in a very respectful position. This tournament scores points based on the total length of the fish to the nearest ½ inch. This year one of our teams finished in 5th place, and we have always been in the top 20 with both teams. The fishing conditions on Saturday were really tough - winds out of the NNE at 20 – 25 mph, spitting rain, and a strong current running down the beach. Eight ounce sinkers would not hold bottom, and "sputnik" sinkers were not much better. Our Team A finished in 5th place with 7 fish for 87.5 points. Team B finished in 20th place with 2 fish for 20.75 points. The VBAC has some really good surf fisherman! The top scorers from this year's Team A are Kelly Hoggard with 3 fish for 37.50 points, Greg Wehner with 2 fish and 25.5 points and Doug Wehner with 1 fish and 12 points. From Team B are Mike Anderson with 1 fish for 10.50 points, and Larry Regula with 1 fish for 10.25 points. Thanks to all the members who made the trip!





Additional Fishing Reports

So had the time this afternoon to run Twice Bitten to the fuel dock. It was just myself and Chloe the beagle. Put in 43 gallons in prep for the weekend. Had to try for a few spot for dinner. Caught 6 in an hour. Largest was a tad over 7 ounces. Hard to tell on long bay points outdoor scale. Connie at long bay verified the weight. After he got in some laughing, I explained the club challenge to him. Be safe and fish on.

After a totally enjoyable weekend in Hatteras, I was itching to get Twice Bitten fishing again. My buddy David Swoope and I set out in search of Spot. Poked around all of the places I have slammed them before. Tried 6 or 8 places only catching a few worth keeping. Caught a lot of flounder candy size so they went in the livewell. Poked our nose out in the bay around the Lynnhaven pier and pound nets. Tons of baby grey trout!!! Great to see them coming back again. Overall, it was a day of fishing not catching. We returned to the dock with a good fish fry worth. Biggest I caught was 8.378 ounces on my digital scale. Not complaining mind you, any day fishing is GREAT! Our bait of choice was different kinds of fishbites and real bloodworms using double bottom rigs and large sabiki shrimp rigs. David did manage to catch a couple roundhead in the mix. We ran about 12 miles overall and burned 3 gallons. Tide was ripping coming in and had to get on

plane to pass Lesner bridge.



Took the chance last weekend to try surf fishing. As most of you know this is way out of my normal style. I got invited to the Hatteras invitational to fish for our club. Ran down Thursday to a warm reception from fellow anglers. Reception Thursday had lots of good eats. Started out Friday morning with our group, riding w/ Robbie Parks. Robbie had no problem with showing me the proper bait prep and rigging... soaking it all in. Caught a few and scored. Friday night I hiked over to the local bait shop and found they had fresh finger mullet..SCORE! Got 3 lbs. Cleaned up and went to the next banquet. Up early to make breakfast and then off to try again. Caught a nice grey trout right off the bat but nothing later for that session. Our spot for the afternoon was 74. End of the beach. Looked great to me and found a beautiful seashell as soon as I got out of the truck. Set out our gear but a little slow for me, Jerry and Russell pulled in a couple. Here's the fun part! 11 minutes to go and I finally caught a bluefish worth scoring. Threw back out and another but too small. Robbie looks at me with 6 minutes to go and says "we have time for 3 more" Fresh baits out and We did it!!! Robbie got one and I got a double.. We scored well in the tournament; 17th. Just want to thank all on my team for teaching me and being patient as my casts were not always straight. Just TOO much fun. Thanx to all!!

Additional Fishing Captures

September 27th

Here is a picture of a 1 lb. 3 oz. croaker I caught 9/25 that I will submit to Chris at the meeting next week for the Roulette. Caught him and a half dozen more while we were waiting for the tide to shift so we could go back to trout fishing. Caught using white swimming mullet Gulp on jigs using light spinning rods. They fought like bigger puppy drum. Weighed this one at Ocean's East by Jimmy. Hopefully I'll be catching bigger ones soon.





October 3rd

Great day in Little Creek on Louis Glaser's boat with Jerry Gaines catching 9 speckled trout on MirrOlures up to 23.5 inches and 9 croakers on gulp up to 1 pound. The biggest was caught by Louis, 23.5 inches and on the incoming tide.
