Saturday, June 24th: Seton Youth Fishing Day



Conservation and Regulations

Provided by various individuals, conservation organizations, and regulation commissions.

Mid Atlantic Fisheries Management Council (MAFMC): MAFMC has their spring meeting scheduled for Tuesday, April 11th, 2017 through Thursday, April 13th, 2017 in Avalon, New Jersey. There is a variety of topics that will include tilefish discussions for the 2018-2020 management measures. A link which will allow you to view their meetings via the web can be found on their website. The upcoming agenda can be viewed HERE.

Virginia Cobia Regulations: VMRC convened on Tuesday, March 28th to establish the 2017 cobia regulations for Virginia. There were a couple of different proposals but amendments concluded with the following regulations:

- -1 fish per person or 3 fish per boat maximum (whichever is less).
- -Open season from June 1st to September 15th, 2017.
- -40" Total length minimum. Only one fish per boat can measure 50+ inches.
- -No gaffing allowed.
- -Free state permit required for the fishing/possession of cobia. The captain/owner is responsible for the reporting requirements of all cobia fishing trips including trips which lead to no fish being caught or kept. Failure to comply will result in the captain/owner being withheld from receiving a cobia fishing permit in the following calendar year.

Economic Benefits of Fishing to the US Economy: The American Sportfishing Association has released figures which identify the financial impacts of fishing in the United States. These financial impacts are broken down into the congressional districts for each state. More information is available on their website.

Sustainable Fisheries Goal Implementation Team: The Chesapeake Bay Program has released their March 2017 newsletter detailing sustainable fisheries. North Carolina Beach Access: There has been a lot of strife in recent years where anglers and beach goers have butt heads with lawmakers about North Carolina beach access. Recent improvements include permits being available to buy online and year to date purchase usability. There is <u>additional information in the following letter</u> which has been sent to interested parties by the Cape Hatteras Access Preservation Alliance (CHAPA).

Monthly Fishing Contest

Much like last year, the club will be featuring a **Fish of the Month** competition open to all members. One fish will be designated each month as the 'fish of the month'. The longest fish measured in that species for the month will win a \$30 prize from the club. The competition runs from March to December for 2017.

Competition Rules:

- The competition is based on the fish's total length. (There is no minimum length requirement to win.)
- Your fish must have a photo with its verified length visible in the picture via a ruler or tape measure behind or next to the fish. (Please note: Take multiple pictures so you can have one of the fish's length and one of you holding your prize winning catch!)
- You must submit the photo(s) along with a short caption or story about your fishing experience for the newsletter.
- The fish must meet the general requirements of the club prize fishing contest and be turned into the prize fish committee.

March: Catfish (any species) Winner: Still Undetermined

April: Crappie

Fishing Reports

December 2016: An error caused me to lose a fishing report of two our club members. I've taken time to highlight their successful adventure here. Preston caught this 2-pound Crappie while fishing out of Lake Smith on his new boat. Meanwhile, Gary caught this 1-pound 2-ounce crappie while fishing with Preston that same December day. Now go out and catch one this April!



Fishing Reports

Early March on the Piankatank River: Ike Eisenhower went out with Melanie Bayford in early March to target some catfish. Melanie invited me to fish the Piankatank on 2/28 with her and since it was my first time on this river, it was quite the adventure for me. A 90-minute drive up US 17 through Gloucester almost to Saluda is not something I've done much in my life but the trip traffic was minimum and I was early for our 9am ramp departure. Melanie and Don live right off the river so ramping the boat was done by Mel easily. It was a beautiful comfortable and cloudy day. We had no bites until around noon when we started getting one fish after another on our frozen menhaden baits. We each had 3 rods out and at times had two on at one time. We each had light rods so 7-10 pound fish make a huge run at times using light drag from start to finish which is the most fun way to catch them. The biggest was around 10 pounds and I believe we caught about 15 or more. Not sure because we filled her cooler and ended up keeping in the 8-10 pound range and four smaller ones just to see how much meat was on the smaller ones (pictured). I should have taken a picture of Mel with her biggest but didn't think of picture taking until the day was over. We left the biting around 4 pm. I didn't want to drive through the back roads in the dark. All in all, I had two hours of cleaning those fish the next day and plenty of catfish in the freezer. It was a memorable time fishing and catching catfish on the Piankatank with Melanie. Thanks a bunch for the trip.



Surf Fishing in Wilmington, NC: I went down to visit my mom in North Carolina during the first week of March. The water was fairly cold but managed to find a few roundhead and puffer fish along Wrightsville beach. The area is very pretty and the surf was low. The water temps were pretty cool on the north east side of the cape fear river. All of the fish were beyond the break line of the sand bar so it took some heavier weights and a little wading to get the baits out past the bar. The action was hot after sunset but most fish were not very big. I brought in about a dozen with a half dozen that were 12". It was enough to make a fish fry the next afternoon and went well with some hushpuppies and mac and cheese.

Fishing Reports

Catfishing on the James: Russell Willoughby, Bob Stuhlman and I fished the James River again with charter fisherman Capt. Pete. This was Russell and my second time fishing with Captain Pete and since we got citations last year we thought we'd try it again but this time we brought Bob. It was a cold morning at the Jordan River Bridge yatch basin when we met Capt. Petey, but there was no wind to speak of so we weren't too uncomfortable and it promised to be warm in the afternoon. The catfish bite started right off with Russell bringing in a 24 pound fish within the first hour. Next, I got a 37-pounder. Then bob caught a 20 pounded followed by a 34 pounder by Russell and myself again with a 12 pound eating six fish. All of these we caught before 9 o'clock in the morning all at one place right off the channel. Then when the bite quieted down, we moved to another spot and bob got a 48 pound monster in about 8 feet of water. We struggled going from place to place looking for a bite as the warm wind picked up and we managed to pick up another 20 pounder for Russell and myself but Bob wasn't lucky enough to get a 3rd fish. But what the heck, he got a monster 48 pounder and definitely is going to be a major challenger for the roulette fish of the year in VBAC. Congrats to Bob! Thanks to Captain Pete for a great catfishing trip!

Fishing Reports

Dr. Ike and Melanie on 3-30-17: Dr. Ike made a 2nd trip to Gloucester to check out one of my boats for sale. We went fishing for big catfish for the fish of the month competition on the Piankatank River. The day did not start well for us. Possible ignition key problem kept the 9.9hp motor from starting. We decided to use the min-kota to fish with and not go as far. We anchored for a while with no results and moved a short distance up the river. We had two floats out with mud minnows on board and used menhaden for the bottom baits. We had a speckled trout on that almost made it to the net, then the catfish started to bite. We caught two small ones, then the bobber got another speckled trout that was 22 inches. Then an eel came aboard. We cut his head off and used pieces of eel for bait. The catfish loved it!!! The lines were screaming. Lost one big one on the anchor line, then landed a 30" catfish. A short time later, Dr. Ike had a screamer on board and I thought he would get a bigger one than I had. His was 29". We had several runs that did not hook up and then the bite died off. Cold, gray, windy day, but the fishing was excellent.
