You are always welcome to continue fishing if you want – some do. It is always a good time and you get bragging rights until the fall tournament. Hunt for Hardheads Fishing Tournament

Each year, the south side fishing clubs battle it to the death (of a few fish) to obtain bragging rights over other local clubs. The tournament features a morning fishing session followed by weigh in around lunch time. A luncheon is provided to all participants where we can mingle with other clubs and their representatives. After the scores are tallied, the winner is crowned. Each club is allowed to fish 5 boats with 3 anglers and the option to pay for additional anglers on a boat. All money collected for the event will benefit a local chapter of Wish a Fish. Last year, it was our club that reigned supreme but we need some boats and anglers to fill empty spots left on our sign ups. Please make an effort to sign up and fish for this year's event at our May club meeting. If you cannot make this month's meeting but would like to participate, you can email us and I will get you into an open spots.

Rules:

- 1- Clubs are limited to five boats. Team captains must be club members.
- **2-** Teams must register in advance.
- **3-** Boats may depart from any Virginia port.
- **4-** The boundaries for fishing is any waterway and river 500 yards outside of the HRBT and inward to the James and Elizabeth rivers and their tributaries.
- **5-** Fish are measured by length only.
- **6-** Qualifying fish include Croaker, Bluefish, and Flounder.
- **7-** Points are awarded based on total length: 5 points for 1st, 4 points for 2nd, 3 points for 3rd, 2 points for 4th, and 1 point for 5th for of each eligible species.
- **8-** Whichever club accumulates the most points, wins the tournament.

Saturday, June 24th: Seton Youth Fishing Day



Conservation and Regulations

Provided by various individuals, conservation organizations, and regulation commissions.

Menhaden - Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Council (ASMFC): I stumbled across a menhaden resources document that was presented to the public in late 2016. This document entails decisions that ASMFC was looking at regarding menhaden harvest across the east coast. They detail some different information like quota allocation and stock assessment status for menhaden. For those interested in reading about the document, <u>Click Here</u>.

New North Caroline Cobia Regulations in effect May 1st: North Carolina DNR voted in late February to set their cobia regulations for 2017. The coastal season opened on May 1st and runs until September 30th. You can view all of the North Carolina fishing regulations by going to the NCDENR website.

Virginia Fishing Regulations: As our fishing season begins to ramp up. It is a good idea to familiarize yourself with the different fishing species and regulations that are enforced in our state. For example, you might go fishing this weekend and accidently catch a sheepshead or cobia on the drum grounds and wonder what fish it is or what the limits are (I stumbled upon both of those in the same trip while fishing for black drum two years ago). You can review the regulations on the VMRC website. They also offer a variety of other information including wreck and reef numbers, fishing license links, and state record sizes that you might find of interest.

Chesapeake Bay Funding for the EPA: At a recent town hall discussion with Congressman Bobby Scott, information that he presented showed \$0 of funding for the EPA commission region for the Chesapeake Bay. While this may not be true and may be fixed in the near future, cuts to the EPA are expected to be widespread which means that we need to be more persistent in taking care of our greatest local resource.

Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council (MAFMC): NOAA Fisheries has published a proposed rule for the Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council's Unmanaged Forage Fish Omnibus Amendment. The amendment would implement an annual landing limit, possession limits, and permitting and reporting requirements for certain previously unmanaged forage species and species groups within Mid-Atlantic Federal waters. The purpose of this action is to prevent the development of new, and the expansion of existing, commercial fisheries on certain forage species until the council has adequate opportunity and information to evaluate the potential impacts of forage fish harvest on existing fisheries, fishing communities, and the marine ecosystem. Proposed Rule Here.

Proposed Amendment to Cobia Quotas: At a recent meeting in Charleston, South Carolina, there is an emergency action amendment that will be brought to the next SAFMC meeting which will be voted on to decide if current quota allocations should be reversed to the previous key west boundary. The belief is that this action will not be ratified, but it is encouraging that the committee saw this as a viable option to relieve stress on the situation.

Monthly Fishing Contest

Much like last year, the club will be featuring a **Fish of the Month** competition open to all members. One fish will be designated each month as the 'fish of the month'. The longest fish measured in that species for the month will win a \$30 prize from the club. The competition runs from March to December for 2017.

Competition Rules:

- The competition is based on the fish's total length. (There is no minimum length requirement to win.)
- Your fish must have a photo with its verified length visible in the picture via a ruler or tape measure behind or next to the fish. (<u>Please note:</u> Take multiple pictures so you can have one of the fish's length and one of you holding your prize winning catch!)
- You must submit the photo(s) along with a short caption or story about your fishing experience for the newsletter.
- The fish must meet the general requirements of the club prize fishing contest and be turned into the prize fish committee.



Outgoing current setup on the second Island in 13-16 ft. on the spine and in very little time Bob started pulling in throwback size tautogs 13-15 inches. We ended up with 14 caught between 11:30 and 1pm with three of them going 17 and a half inches.
