Conservation and Regulations

Provided by various individuals, conservation organizations, and regulation commissions.

Menhaden - Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (ASMFC): The ASMFC recently voted on menhaden catch quota along the east coast for coming years. There were more than 100,000 submissions to decrease catch quota, but rather, the total quota was increased nearly 20%. One good benefit that came from the most recent vote was the reduction of the Chesapeake Bay quota by 41%. It is a win for our region but overall impacts need to be monitored as the fish hopefully recovers here.

Marine Sportfish Collection Project: The Marine Sportfish Collection Project is a data collection project that comes primarily from recreational anglers. There are a variety of ice chest style freezers around some of the area tackle shops and marinas. After fileting the fish, you place the carcass into a garbage bag and fill out an informational card to be placed in the bag with the fish. You can view more about the project by going to the provided link. <u>Virginia Recreational Assessment Program</u>

VIMS – Virginia Game Fish Tagging Program(VGFTP): The VGFTP was created in 1995. The program allows for your average recreational angler to tag and release fish to hopefully be caught in the future by other anglers and provide data analysis on the fish you caught. Fish targeted include Cobia, Spadefish, Sheepshead, Red Drum, Flounder, and more. There are some basic requirements and space is limited. 2018 signups will run through December 10th, 2017. Monthly Fishing Contest

The Surf Fishing Committee selected Carl McCoy and Larry Regula to return on the Hatteras Village Civic Association Team "B" in 2018.

I hope everyone had a wonderful Christmas and will have a Happy New Year. On December 2nd this year, I got a call from a friend of mine and he told me they were catching large sea mullet on Hatteras Island, NC. I would have loved to have gone immediately but as responsibility would be, I had to wait until the next morning to go down. Not a lot of people can go at the drop of the hat, ha! ha! Fortunately, I have a wife that understands, or "puts up with me" thank goodness. So based on my past experiences, I thought it would be a good idea to try and go down for a couple of days. So I called a friend of mine, Jim Wisenberg, who actually wanted to leave that night but I couldn't go until the next morning We made a last minute reservation at the Lighthouse Motel in Buxton, NC. We arrived at about 1 p.m. and after unloading our stuff at the Lighthouse Motel, we went down Ramp 34 in Avon. We pulled down on the beach and caught the last third of an outgoing tide. No one was around so there was no one to ask if any fish had been caught. It was one of the few precious moments where no one was around and we were catching fish like mad on fresh shrimp that we had purchased on the side of the road on the way down. I spotted a place along the beach where there was a wash-out and a sandbar with a decent trough between the sandbar and the shore. The water was not very rough at all but it looked good for some reason. We set up on the beach and I sat my rod up with single drops with a 20 lb. fluorocarbon leader and only had to use a 2 oz. weight. I threw out for the front side of the bar and Jim was fishing towards shore more in the trough. It had not been two minutes and I caught a sea mullet that I could tell right away was a citation. I caught four more after that. All were over a pound. Then I caught another citation, 1 1/2 lb. And then three more mullets that were over a pound. Numerous after that were pushing a pound. All were in the 13-15 inch range. Jim caught a 26 inch black drum and a 18 inch black drum and several sea mullet that were around a pound. Not very often have I been fishing when I could tell someone "you should have been here yesterday". In this case, yesterday was today. What a wonderful trip we had. We were actually tired from catching fish, ha! ha! Tight Lines, Butch Eason, very happy fisherman



Fishing Reports

Fishing on the Piankatank River - Melanie Bayford

I went fishing by myself on the Piankatank River on Sunday, 11/26/17. I decided it best to try a new area. I took four fishing rods and had only three of them out when a big catfish started screaming out some line! He tried to take the line to some cypress knees in the water, then went under the anchor rope and under the boat twice before finding the net. Since he was a 20lb Channel Catfish, I decided to keep for a weight citation. I had to wait until Monday to get it weighed due to the availability of a scale here on Sunday evening in Gloucester. 16 lbs 12 oz was the weight the next day. It was a lot of fun and an exciting fight.

Surf Fishing in Wilmington – Kelly Hoggard (Right Picture)

I went down to visit my mom while celebrating my birthday weekend. The weather was fairly nice except for some fog coming in off the water. I walked around a while and ran into a local gentlemen on the sound side who caught a nice keeper flounder with some live finger mullet. The finger mullet were as thick as bee's, some schooling in as little as 6" of water while being chased by the bluefish. I borrowed his cast net and had about two dozen for myself and set up on the inside of the breakwater on the ocean side of Masonboro Inlet. The tide was low when I got there and coming in the entire time. Managed a few nice hits on the live mullet with 2/0 circle hooks. All big bluefish between 14" and 18". They made a nice dinner and I look forward to doing some more surf fishing on the other side of winter.

On Thursday, Dec 21, I decided to try my luck fishing for yellow perch at Beaverdam Park here in Gloucester. My fishing success there has been limited, and many people have told me it is a difficult place to fish. I had a few hurdles to start the day. First, I realized that my bottom reader was in another bag that I did not bring. Then I noticed that the spare battery I brought to run the electric motor did not have wing nut posts to hook motor up to. Beaverdam is electric motors only. Being a mostly prepared person, I decided to grab my jumper cables and try to connect both batteries to get some extra juice. Since both batteries were mostly under my butt, I prayed that I wouldn't catch my rear end on fire.

Two helpful people at the ramp suggested I try areas where seagulls were hitting the water. I trolled around a bit with no luck. Then I anchored and tried bobbers. No luck. Then I noticed two people that appeared to be jigging bringing up some fish. I hauled anchor and tied a few quick bottom rigs. Then I shot a minnow down and drifted. Within minutes I had a nice yellow perch on. Kept drifting and going back to the head of the drift and caught 7 yellow perch in about 20 minutes. I threw them in with the minnows to keep them alive and had the ranger measure for a release. At least one was over 9 inches, so I ran them all down to the water and released them alive. I was needing one more species for a master angler award and got lucky at Beaverdam. Preston asked for pictures so when I went fishing again on Dec. 26, I kept two fish to take a picture. Melanie
