Council and Commission Recommend Recreational Bluefish Management Measures for 2020

ANNAPOLIS, MD – Last week, the Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council (Council) recommended and the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission (Commission) approved new recreational fishing regulations for the 2020 Atlantic bluefish fishery from Florida to Maine. These measures, which include a 3-fish bag limit for private anglers and shore-based fishermen and a 5-fish bag limit for for-hire fishermen, represent a substantial reduction compared to the federal 15-fish bag limit that has been in place since 2000. The Commission's actions are final and apply to state waters (0-3 miles from shore), while the Council will forward its recommendation for federal waters (3 – 200 miles from shore) to the NOAA Fisheries Greater Atlantic Regional Fisheries Administrator for final approval.

The most recent operational assessment of the Atlantic bluefish stock concluded that the stock is overfished but not experiencing overfishing. During their joint meeting in October, the Council and Commission adopted a recreational harvest limit (RHL) of 9.48 million pounds for 2020 and 2021, which is an 18% decrease compared to the 2019 RHL. Using the current regulations, the recreational sector is projected to land 13.27 million pounds, which will exceed the RHL by 28.56%. Therefore, the Council and Commission met last week to approve new recreational management measures to constrain harvest to the reduced RHL.

The Council and Commission considered several combinations of bag limits and minimum size limits, including options to set a single set of regulations for all fishing modes or different regulations for shore/private modes and the for-hire mode. Although the Council's Bluefish Monitoring Committee recommended a coastwide 3-fish bag limit, the majority of comments from the public and Bluefish Advisory Panel (AP) members expressed opposition to this option, noting that it would have severe economic consequences for the for-hire sector, which was only responsible for 3.6% of coastwide landings from 2016 to 2018. Additionally, AP members and the public emphasized that these proposed reductions come at a challenging time for for-hire stakeholders as they are also facing new restrictions on striped bass, black sea bass, summer flounder, and scup.

After an extensive discussion and thorough consideration of public comments, the Council recommended and Commission approved a 3-fish bag limit for private and shore modes and a 5-fish bag limit for the for-hire mode. No restrictions were made to minimum fish size or seasons.

"For many years, bluefish has been one of our most abundant recreational fisheries," said Council Chairman and ASMFC Board member Mike Luisi. "The Council and Commission are fully committed to the effective conservation and management of this stock, but we also recognize that a sudden change in regulations could have severe socioeconomic consequences for some stakeholders. After evaluating a wide range of options and considering numerous comments from the public, we feel that this approach is the most fair and effective way to achieve the necessary reduction in harvest next year."

The Council and Commission are continuing to work on development of a rebuilding plan as part of the Bluefish Allocation and Rebuilding Amendment. Additional information and updates on this action are available at http://www.mafmc.org/actions/bluefish-allocation-amendment

As many of you know, yesterday was a great day for the Bay. The new federal budget, signed into law, increased

critical funds for Bay restoration. Good!

But today, bad news! There is now another threat to saving the Bay and its rivers and streams. **EPA refuses to**

hold Pennsylvania accountable for failing to prepare an adequate Phase III Watershed Implementation

Plan as required by federal law.

While Virginia and Maryland still have work to do, both states have outlined plans identifying the programs and

practices to be put in place by 2025 that will restore local water quality. Pennsylvania's plan, however, continues

to be *sorely* deficient.

Despite that fact, EPA did not take any action to require Pennsylvania to meet its obligations.

The Chesapeake Clean Water Blueprint has been lauded as the best—and last—chance to save the Bay. Whereas

previous plans to clean up the Bay were voluntary, the Blueprint combines science-based pollution limits with

timelines and accountability. By not holding Pennsylvania's leadership accountable, EPA has failed to fulfill

its obligation to be the referee of the federal-state partnership. EPA is kicking the can down the road,

abdicating its Clean Water Act responsibilities and putting all of Bay restoration in jeopardy.

We're now in the final and most important phase of the Bay clean-up effort. This may well be the last chance to

get this right. The health of our region's environment, our way of life, and nearly \$130 billion in natural

benefits annually are at stake.

Eleven years ago next month, CBF sued EPA over its failure to uphold the Clean Water Act. EPA's continued

failure means we must consider that option again. Stay tuned for more information.

THINK 60 - Cold Water Danger Paddle Craft Risk

What: In conjunction with the United States Coast Guard (USCG) Sector Virginia the "THINK 60 - Cold Water Danger" paddle craft risk program has been created to identify the combination of "fair" warm days when a significant number of paddle craft are expected on the water when waters remain cold, increasing the risk of drowning from capsize incidents.

Criteria: THINK 60 - The Cold Water Danger criteria were established with the USCG identifying heightened risk days based water temperatures below 60 degrees and air temperatures above 60. To clarify, even on days when the weather criteria are not met, cold water is always dangerous.

Issuance: The program will be in effect generally from March through April and November into early December. When a risk day is identified, the NWS in Wakefield will provide alerts via social media using Facebook and Twitter.

Your Role: Monitor social media and when there is a "Cold Water Danger – Paddle Craft Risk" (#paddlecraftrisk, #think60) for your area, take the necessary precautions and be prepared for the cold water danger. This includes having all the proper gear and notifying others of your float plan.



The USCG reports that statistically cold water incidents peaked on nice, sunny weekends. Research has shown that the two factors which best relate to cold water fatalities are "Cold Water Shock" and hypothermia. Cold Water Shock occurs when water is below 60 degrees and the difference between the water and air temperature is > 15 degrees. Hypothermia threat increases significantly in water temperature less than 60 degrees

Speckled Trout in the Elizabeth River 12/24/19

I fished with Russell Willoughby and Jerry Hughes on Christmas Eve on his Mako in the Elizabeth River. The wind was blowing bad out of the North on the bay so we opted to check out the ER for speckled trout since both of them had fished it earlier and caught several keepers. We started back in the Deep Creek once we found an area out of the blowing wind. We tried mostly jigs and soft bodies until Russell put on a 3 inch swim bait in shad color and caught one immediately in about 10 ft depth as we drifted. This was a nice 18 inch speck. In no time we had 5 in the boat between 17-20 inch specks but then the tide died and that was it for the day. We tried other places along the Deep Creek and Elizabeth River but no luck as the incoming tide was slow moving.

Stripers at the Little Creek

Fished with Louis Glaser three days in December the Little Creek for stripers. On 12/4 we got two, a 29 incher and a 28 incher on Wind Cheaters. But, unfortunately we only caught one 23 incher on 12/9 and a 21 incher on 12/16. Again Wind Cheaters were the ticket in a very fast moving tide, either incoming or outgoing.
