I will participate in the Great Bridge Fisherman's Association 13 th Annual Fishing Flea Market on Saturday March 12, 2022 at the Chesapeake Conference Center, 700 Conference Center Dr. Chesapeake Virginia 23320. I agree and understand the following:

Saltwater) New, used, custom and home- made equipment including rods, reels, lures, All merchandise must be geared towards the Fisherman/Outdoor needs. Fly, Fresh Water Tackle, storage boxes, electric or gas motors, boating gear and electronics are acceptable. Boats are available to be displayed at \$3.00 per foot. The staff reserves the right to request the Vendor remove any merchandise deemed unacceptable during this event.

The hours of operation on Saturday are from 8:00 AM – 2:30 PM. Vendors will be allowed to set up after 4:00 PM on Friday and starting at 5:30 AM on Saturday morning. Vendors must vacate the building by 4:00 PM on Saturday. Locations are determined by the staff and will be assigned to each Vendor when registering. Only booths are guaranteed, not the location. There will be a limit to 3 booths per Vendor. All Vendors, need to set up before 7:00 AM. After 7 AM, booths will be reassigned as needed. After unloading merchandise, Vendors must move their vehicles to assigned area. Security will be provided overnight Friday. We encourage all Vendors to set up Friday afternoon or Friday night up to 10 PM All payments, once deposited are non-refundable if a Vendor cancels. The GBFA and the Flea Market staff are not responsible for any loss or damage to Vendors merchandise

Two admission tickets per Vendor. This will be strictly enforced. Vendors with more than two tables will other options.

Boat Tax Refunds

Hey, DO YOU WANT TO GET SOME OF THE MONEY YOU SPENT ON BOAT GAS BACK FROM THE STATE? Would a little extra cash during the holidays help your wallet?

It's yours for the asking, and like all things involving the state, the ask is simple in principle.

Did you know that \$0.26 of each gallon of gas (or \$0.27 for diesel) that you put into your boat is earmarked by the state of Virginia for a fuels tax fund which goes directly to maintain roads and highways in the state?

And you do realize that you don't drive your boat on the roads or highways in Virginia, right? So those monies that you are paying the state are not applicable to boats that are used on the waterways.

The State decided some time ago to make it possible for that money to be returned to boaters via a refund process, which unfortunately has not been widely advertised.

VSSA is hoping to spread the word among all the boaters out there to help you get a Christmas (or New Year, or Valentines, or whatever) bonus through the **Fuels Tax Refund** program.

You are probably wondering, what kinds Of boats are eligible? Well, that's simple: the DMV website says plainly under their ELIGIBLE USE CONDITIONS, boats or watercraft:

1. Used in operating or propelling commercial watercraft.
2. Used in operating or propelling recreational and pleasure watercraft.

That means pretty much any boat that is out on the water for whatever reason.

HOW DO I DO THIS?

The refund process is straightforward. Registration is required the first time you use the [Fuels Tax Online Refund](#) system; thereafter, logon with your email address and the password you have chosen for your account.

To register for an account online, go to the [DMV Fuel Tax Refund Page](#).

Then fill out the online web form to make your claim. Be careful following the prompts!

For first time applicants, just gather all of the receipts for the gas you bought for your boat in the past year and scan them to make either electronic copies or paper copies of the receipts and submit them with your first claim in the system. Future claims do not require that you send the receipts with the claim, but you must retain the them.

The online system is the easiest to use, but if you don't like doing this stuff online and want to do it with the paper form, just print out the PDF Refund form available at:

The Virginia Beach Anglers Club put in a good effort at the CHAC Surf Fishing Tournament November 4-6. We fished two teams. Team B got the best of Team A in this one. In a twist of luck, the two teams fished next to each other on Friday morning south of the point. Team B fished site 70 and Team A fished site 71.

Team B finished in 21st with 11 fish for 67 points. Greg and Doug both led the team with puppy drums. Greg's puppy drum measured 26 inches and scored 28 points. Doug's puppy drum measured 22 inches and scored 16 points. They both caught their puppies at the start of the morning on day two and contributed to one of the highest scoring sessions in the tournament Friday morning. On Friday afternoon, Mark lost a nice puppy drum in the wash that could have vaulted the team up the leader board even further. As always, lessons were learned from marks near catch and it makes each member who hears of the account a more prepared angler for next year.

Team A started the tournament off well on day one. They were nearly top 10 after the first session with Robbie's 28.75 inch puppy drum to start the Thursday morning session. Though it was a great start, they scored little throughout the remainder of the tournament and slowly fell down the leaderboard to 24th. Team A finished with 10 fish for 56 points.

The winds started to blow that week on Tuesday afternoon when a front came through. From then on, winds blew a consistent 20+ mph out of the north, slowly shifting to the north east by Friday afternoon. Saturday, winds howled from the East and North East. Seas were building to 10+ feet and there were threats of washouts on the island. A few anglers braved the conditions and fished Saturday mornings individual tournament. Doug, Robbie, Kelly and Brian (one of Doug's sons) all fished Ramp 48 together on Saturday morning with little luck. There were a few roundhead and bluefish caught but they were all small. With an hour left, Kelly decided to throw out a shark rig and did get lucky to wrestle with Sand Tiger shark! It was about 80" and was a nice catch for the conditions.

The last of us left Hatteras on Saturday afternoon. NC12 did not last long as it washed out partially during the Saturday evening high tide shortly after sunset. It reopened just long enough for a few vehicles to get out on Sunday morning before high tide again claimed the road. NC12 remained washed out until Tuesday afternoon. Seas peaked on Sunday at about 10-15 feet and caused some serious damage along parts of pea island. Problems remain from the washout and are continuing weeks later. North Carolina Governor Cooper declared a state of emergency to provide emergency funds for repairs through Christmas. The CHAC tournament concludes our yearly schedule of surf fishing events. We are excited to be fishing more events in 2022 and look forward to having as many of our anglers as possible involved. Keep an eye out for the February and March drawings for the 2022 surf tournaments!

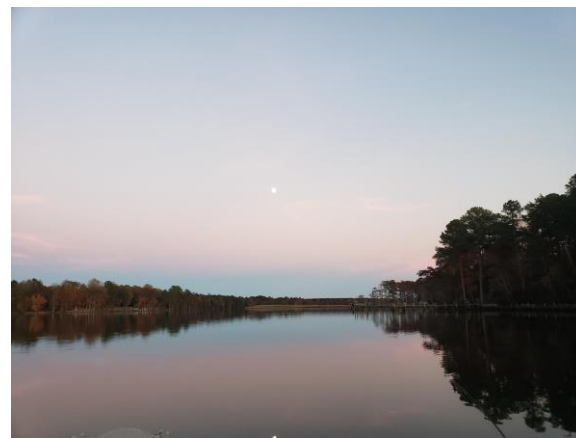
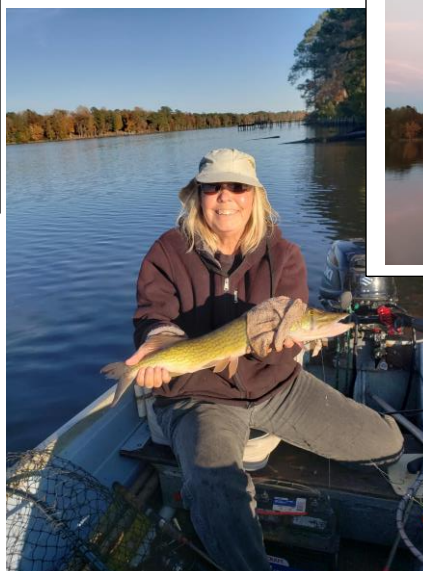
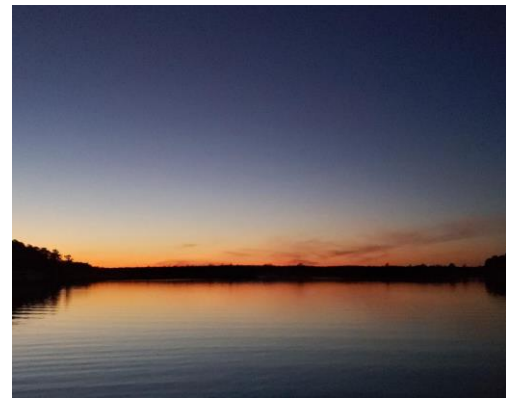
Prize releases on 11/4/21

Ned Smith and I went fishing the Pretty Lake in Louis' boat with the wind blowing at about 10-15mph from the NE and caught only throwbacks out of several places there. This was fun but just before we decided to give up on the fishing we decided to try the jetties just in case there might be a bite if the wind allowed us to cast adequately. We set up in about 5ft of water and having to throw into the wind when we wanted the lure to hit near the rocks. On my first cast I hooked a nice 19 incher on a 20MR MirrOlure and that began a period of catching one after another, almost every cast I was able to hook up a keeper sized fish. At the same time Ned began catching the same way. I ended up with a 21.5 inch prize release and a 20 inch prize release. Ned also got a 20 inch prize release. We just kept fishing until they slowed down and we started getting tired and the wind got stronger. We counted 32 keeper fish over the three hour period. The key seemed to be to let the lure drift with the outgoing tide before twitching the lure. They seemed to bite right after that first twitch. We kept our limit of ten with all other fish being released.

Alan and I got into a mess of fish, mostly bowfins, but they were hitting just after the bait hit the water. We caught about 50 bowfins. I got two that were 28 inches and two for 23 inches, the rest were not club points. Alan got several that were 24 inches and he got a release citation yellow perch. I also got a chain pickerel that was 23 inches, and we both caught some chunky, but short, bass. We had never seen a concentration of bowfins like that before. We were anchored in the same spot all afternoon and could see fish coming down the river. Nice day, but temperature kept fluctuating with the wind.

I also have some info regarding dept of natural resources. Alan got robbed of a release citation from the previous week. The DNR informed him that they had changed the rules for release citations and that you have to have a photo with the length of the fish showing clearly in order to get a release citation, even with a witness.

They said they put out a notice, but I did not see one. Pass it on, please.
