2021 VBAC Roulette

Date: Thursday, March 4th, 2021

The roulette fish will be randomly selected at the **March 4th, 2021** membership meeting. In the event the meeting is cancelled, they will be randomly selected at the board meeting. You must declare your entry to the Prize Fish Committee **before** fish selection.

Roulette Information: To promote competitive fishing, the club devised a way to support fishing without providing an unfair advantage to any anglers. The solution involved a wheel that included a variety of freshwater and saltwater species in Virginia. The species are selected at random by spin of the roulette wheel. It costs \$20 for an angler to participate and each species winner receives an equal share of prize money.

Roulette Rules: Any fish caught from 1/1/2021 – 12/31/2021 will qualify. Only the **heaviest** fish in each category will win. Must have contacted the Prize Fish Committee to enter before the wheel is spun. Payment is expected no later than the April 1st, 2020 meeting. You are required to submit your entry via the clubs standard Prize Fish form. Prize Fish/Roulette entries can be submitted in hand or by mail to the Virginia Beach Anglers Club Prize Fish Committee. A table of the current leaders will be kept up to date and posted in each newsletter.

Would you like to learn how seagrass plantings can buffer changes in water chemistry and help with oyster reef restoration? Are you eager to try out a new app that provides short-term forecasts for pH and hypoxia in coastal waters?

Come join us for the "Hooked on Ocean Acidification" mini-series on Thursday evenings, from February 18 to March 11. All four sessions will be held virtually, via ZOOM, from 6:30-8:00 PM. Through this program, we aim to provide Mid-Atlantic anglers, party and charter boat captains and crew, and recreational fishing industry stakeholders with the latest scientific research and apps to understand how ocean acidification may affect your local fisheries and what can be done to reduce the impacts.



RECIPE CORNER

SEAFOOD IN WINE SAUCE

SERVED OVER ANGEL HAIR PASTA

SUBMITTED BY BOB AND SUSAN STUHLMAN

4 (8 oz size) frozen rock lobster tails *

2 lb raw shrimp, shelled and deveined

2 pkg (6 oz size) frozen king crab, thawed and drained**

10 tablespoons butter or margarine

2/3 cup flour

2 teaspoons salt

1/2 teaspoon paprika

Dash white pepper

3 to 3 ½ cups half and half (half milk, half cream)

1 ¼ cups dry white wine

- 1. In large kettle, bring 2 ½ quarts of water to boiling. Add lobster tails; return to boiling. Reduce heat; simmer, covered 8 minutes. With slotted utensil, lift out lobster tails, and set aside until cool enough to handle.
- 2. Return water to boiling. Add shrimp, return to boiling. Reduce heat; simmer covered, 5 minutes, or until tender. Drain.
- 3. Drain crab meat, removing any cartilage and leaving pieces as big as possible.
- 4. Remove meat from lobster shells; cut into bite size pieces.
- 5. Melt butter in Dutch oven; remove from heat. Stir in flour, salt, paprika, and pepper until smooth. Gradually stir in 3 cups half-and-half, mixing to smooth.
- 6. Bring to boiling, stirring. Reduce heat; simmer 5 minutes.
- 7. Add wine, stirring until well combined. Add seafood; stir gently until combined. Cook over low heat until heated through. (Do not boil) Add more half-and-half if sauce is too thick.
- 8. Makes 12 servings.
 - Or used frozen lobster claws and pieces
 - ** Or use 2 cans (7 ½ oz size) king crab meat, drained

Saltwater Fishing News – Tag & Release

Good evening all, today's trip marked the end of the Striped Bass Cooperative Hook and Line tagging for 2021. The crew today managed to tag another 124 fish, bringing the season total to 1,010 (give or take, we'll verify the final data soon)! That is well over our long term average of 700 fish a year and significantly better than the amount tagged in '19 and '20. It is also our 4th most fish tagged in the time series of hook and line tagging. A big thank you to Capt. Ryan and mates Doug and Walt for sticking with us again this year. A huge thank you also to the all the volunteer anglers who offered up their time to help us out. Whether you are receiping in a couple dozen fish in a day or wind up just going on a boat ride, it's still a commitment to volunteer time, get up early and get on the water in the middle of winter. Lastly, I appreciate your patience with the many emails and cancelation notices I send out! It only took a month a day to fit in all 13 trips.... If you are receiving this email I will keep your email on the distribution list unless you tell me otherwise. I will send out notice sometime next Dec. if we are able to do this again in 2022.

First 11 trips were from Ocean City Md. Last two from Rudee.

Left at 7am, went 34 miles out past the Windmill Farm.we were trolling double MOJO rigs off a 32 Oz weight. My first time on a rod was a double with TWO huge stripers. Needed help to get them in. They were at least 30 lbs each. We caught and released 124 stripers. Lots of HUGE fish. The researcher said these were the biggest of all trips taken. I probably caught 20 plus. Exhausted! This is the third time I've done this.




