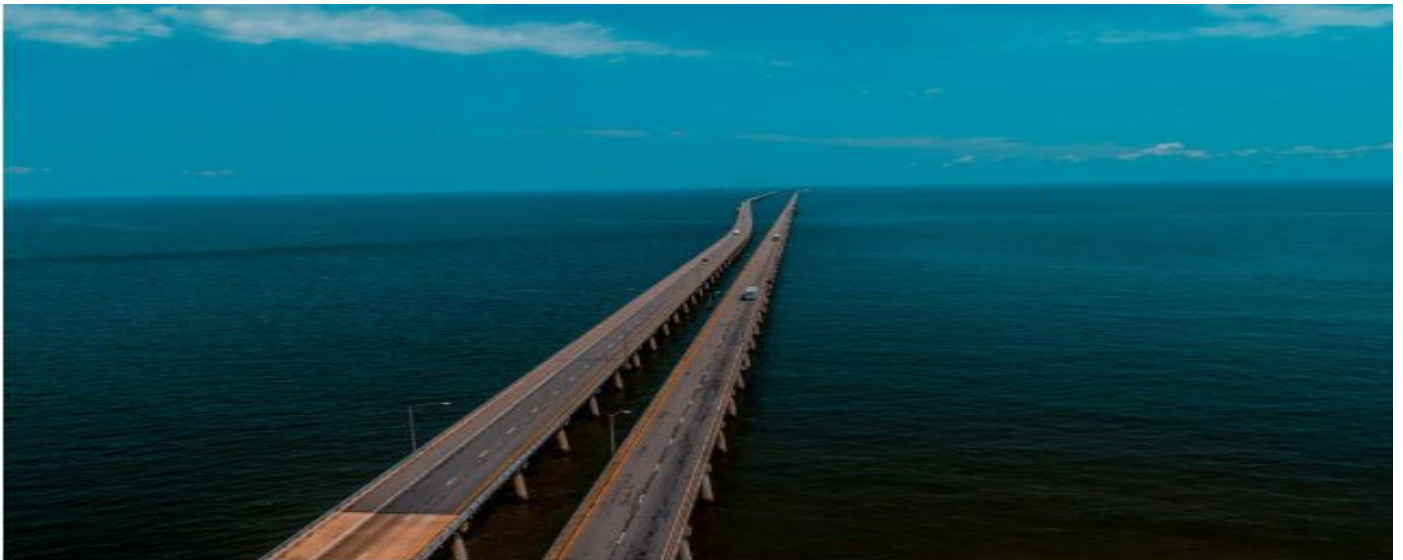

We had 44 friendly faces come out to show supports on Saturday, October the 2nd. We were blessed to welcome many of Stan's family members to enjoy the beach and banquet. 26 anglers participated in the tournament representing all 4 southside fishing clubs. Tidewater Anglers Club, Norfolk Anglers Club, Great Bridge Fisherman's Association and the Virginia Beach Anglers Club all joined together to celebrate the life of Stan and compete in his honor. We'd like to thank both the Virginia Saltwater Sportsman's Association and Great Bridge Fisherman's Association for their generous donations to the tournament as well as the individuals that provided some form of contribution. Anglers competed for over \$800 in cash and prizes and were rewarded with a free Pulled Pork BBQ lunch with sides.

The day was filled with sunny skies and light winds all morning. Many fish were caught but few scored. Anglers faced a calm but difficult surf with low tide approaching and only roundhead were able to score during the tournament. Four anglers made the final leader board and third place was decided via tie breaker. There were no youth anglers to score fish but each of the seven youth anglers walked away with a gift to apply to their fishing dreams. No bluefish or red drum were scored for the largest fish of those species. The first place roundhead catch walked away with \$250! East and North East winds 15+ knots once again dominated the Nags Head Tournament. This tournament has a track record of poor weather and difficult beach conditions. There was enough beach to access the fishing sites and there were very few issues except for some very soft sand on one of the steep off-ramps. Though the weather was rough there were a lot of fish in the surf. Red drum, particularly some puppy drum, were very common in the tournament and many teams scored one. Very few drum were larger than 28 inches but quite a few slot puppy drum were scored including one on each of our club teams! There were also some good size bluefish, many over 15 inches and lots of smaller roundhead were scattered in the surf. Our anglers certainly competed well and it shows with two more great finishes!

Congrats to Jerry Mariano for his 22 inch puppy drum and Caroline Robinson for her 21.5 inch puppy drum. They helped push their respective teams up the leaderboard. Patty Searby also competed in the tournament and she dominated the women's division by scoring the most fish in the tournament. She scored 7 roundhead.

Across the United States, changes in our climate and our oceans are having very real and profound effects on communities, businesses, and the natural resources we depend on—including our economically valuable fisheries and coastal habitat. Understanding these changes and measuring their impacts is an important part of NOAA Fisheries' mission. Every day we work with our partners to provide data and information needed by fishing industries, coastal businesses, local planners, and many others to prepare for and respond to changing conditions.

Our changing climate is affecting life in the oceans, as droughts, floods, rising seas, [ocean acidification](#), and warming oceans change the productivity of our waters and where wildlife live, spawn, and feed. Marine species tend to be highly mobile, and many are moving quickly toward the poles to stay cool as average ocean temperatures rise. These shifts can cause disruptions as predators become separated from their prey. The shifts can also cause economic disruptions if a fish population becomes less productive or moves out of range of the fishermen who catch them.

As a result, fishing industries and coastal businesses face immense challenges. And there is much at risk—marine fisheries and seafood industries supported more than \$244.1 billion in economic activity and 1.74 million jobs in 2017. Coastal habitats also help defend coastal communities from storms and inundation, and provide the foundation for tourism and recreation-based economies in many coastal communities.

For these reasons, NOAA Fisheries is committed to staying ahead of these changes and sustaining our invaluable marine resources for generations to come.
