RED DRUM

(Channel Bass, Redfish, Puppy Drum, Spottail Bass) Sciaenops ocellatus

Description: copper to bronze colored back, fading to a white belly; may be more silvery in appearance in clear or ocean waters; one to several ocellated spots occur at the base of the tail; caudal fin is slightly lunate and pectoral fin is rounded; large scales and underslung jaw.

Similar Fish: closely related and similar in appearance to Black Drum; distinguishable by lack of chin barbels (which are present on black drum), rounded shape of pectoral fin, ocellated spot or spots at base of tail, slightly lunate caudal fin, and generally more streamlined body shape.

Size: up to 100 pounds; average size is 10 - 50 pounds; small fish, called puppy drum, are found in river estuaries, bays, and coastal waters and range from 8 - 20 inches in length.

FISHERIES NOTICE

OFFSHORE SURVEY WORK SEAWARD OF VIRGINIA AND NORTH CAROLINA

Avangrid Renewables will continue to study the Kitty Hawk Offshore Wind Lease Area (OCS-A 0508) and potential export cable corridor routes by conducting High Resolution Geophysical and Geotechnical Surveys from September 17 through mid-December 2021. The purpose of the surveys is to characterize seabed/sub-surface conditions. This survey campaign will include a high-level reconnaissance survey of a cable corridor from the southern corner of the lease extending southerly to Atlantic Beach, North Carolina. Survey work will include multibeam bathymetry, magnetic measurements, side scan sonar imaging, and sub-bottom profiling. The surveys will be conducted by two survey vessels, the ISLAND CHAMPION and DEEP HELDER.

The ISLAND CHAMPION will be supported by two 25' Armada 8 autonomous survey vessels. The autonomous vessels will be operated remotely by and within line-of-sight of the ISLAND CHAMPION. The survey vessels will be towing survey equipment astern and request 0.5 nautical mile closest point of approach. Survey vessels will monitor VHF 16 and 13.

Mariners fishing or transiting offshore between Virginia Beach, VA and Atlantic Beach, NC are encouraged to note the survey area locations, activities, and timing. The Wind Lease Area is WSW of the Cigar and WNW of the Foul Area. seaward from 36 nm SE of Rudee Inlet and beginning 24 nm E of Corolla, NC. The northern cable corridor extends SE from Sandbridge, VA to the NW corner of the Wind Lease Area. The southern cable corridor in this survey extends from the SE corner of the Wind Lease Area south to offshore of Atlantic Beach, NC. Fishermen deploying tended, fixed fishing gear (drop-nets, drop-pots) or mobile gear in the survey areas when survey

vessels are present are requested to coordinate operations through direct bridge-to-bridge communications with the survey vessels. Fishermen are requested to move any unattended fixed fishing gear out of the following survey areas during the survey periods to avoid loss or damage to fishing gear or survey equipment. Fishermen planning to deploy fixed or mobile gear in the survey areas are encouraged to contact Rick Robins, Fisheries Liaison, to coordinate operations.

The work will comply with all federal requirements from the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management, including vessel speed restrictions

and exclusion zones for protected species to minimize disturbance of marine life and habitat.










Dawn Patrol Fishing at Little Creek:

Louis Glaser and I have been getting out fishing the Little Creek jetties at daybreak most every day lately and the results have been sporadic. Fishing with topwater lures I did manage to catch and release two prize fish club minimums: 9/11 a 21 inch speckled trout and on 9/13 a 22 inch speckled trout. Most of the trips we caught 2-3 trout, an occasional puppy drum and several bluefish each trip with the trout mostly in the 17-19 inch range with Louis usually catching 2 for my every 1. But of course sometimes we ended up with no keeper size trout. The wind effects the topwater action a lot interfering with the "walking the dog" action needed to attract the bite. MirrOlure Topdog surface lures worked the best lately. The big fish are coming in but on in small numbers since the water temperature is still 78-80 degrees. Louis has also been catching nice size puppy drum at dusk in the same areas.

Double Limit of Specks at the Little Creek Jetties 9/21: Ned and I had heard from Louis that he, Jerry Gaines and Bert Sainz had gotten limits of trout at daybreak so we decided to give it a try ourselves on the incoming tide. We got out there about 1pm and the current was hardly moving and it was really low tide. I picked up one 18" speck at the end of the jetty and Ned got a couple of throwback sized ones and a couple of lizardfish. The wind was blowing 12-15mph from the east making casting difficult so we tried to fish a couple of other places to no avail. So we headed into the Pretty Lake. No joy there either, just some ribbon fish as we trolled the length of the lake and through the channel in Little Creek all the way to the #5 red marker. So by then the tide had come up and we could see good moving current. As soon as we set up at the jetty again I hooked up with a nice 19 inch speck, then a 21 incher that I released, then one after another from 16 inch to 19 inch. They loved my silver MirrOlure MR 52 so I lent Ned a silver MR 27 to Ned then he started hooking them up. Then he hooked something that pulled line like crazy making us think it was a cownose ray. After a 10 minute fight it turned out to be a 26.5 red drum almost slot keeper. So Ned released it no worse for wear. Overall we caught 16 specks 16-21 inch and that one red of Ned's. Kept our double limit and released 6 specks. We were worn out by 6pm and left them biting. Bait was everywhere around us and the fish were not near the rocks. Best day catching this year. Obviously the specks are in bigger schools now even though the water was still 79 degrees. I heard Louis and Bert went out the next morning and did the same thing.

Sodus Bay, New York

After hearing rave reviews about the salmon and lake trout fishery in Lake Ontario, Dave Steele, Dennis Blohm and I headed out to Sodus Bay, New York Labor Day weekend. Sodus Bay is about 50 miles east of Rochester, north of the Fingers Lake or about 10 hours north of Tidewater. We had planned on 2.5 days of fishing with Predator Charters. Arrived on a Saturday and fished the half day on Sunday.

Headed out Sunday afternoon and trolled up a King Salmon. The Sunday morning half-day had done real well and we expected a great start until the weather closed in. Five to six foot waves and building winds put a quick end to that day.

The first full day charter started at 6 am on Monday and we soon had another King Salmon in the box. However, the skies to the west darkened and the wind kicked up along with the seas. Between Rochester and Sodus Bay, moving east was another line of thunder storms, 50 mph winds, water spouts and appropriate high seas. Back to the barn again.

Tuesday we headed out very early to try and make up for the lost fishing time from the prior day and a half. Blue bird conditions, light winds and a much calmer lake prevailed. Caught a Coho Salmon early and wondered if one fish caught meant time to head in. Fished to late in the afternoon catching lake trout and salmon.

During the trip we caught 6 Lake Trout to 13 lbs, 2 King Salmon to 16 lbs and 5 Coho salmon to 9 lbs. Highly recommend the trip. Captain Wilkinson was great to fish with and set up our lodging for the four nights we were in town.


