The Cape Hatteras Anglers Club Invitational Surf Tournament is the largest team surf event in the world. It hosts 120 teams of 6 for a total of 720 anglers and nearly 75 volunteers during the tournament. The tournament is scattered along many of the best beaches in Hatteras. It encompasses a range of 25+ miles from ramp 23 all the way down to ramp 49. Teams fish four sessions. Two of these sessions are north of the point and two of these sessions are south of the point. Fishing was moderately slow and the fish were smaller than usual. This years tournaments have all been tightly packed with a few points making a big placement difference.

Surf Fishing News Continued

Team A Report:

Our team brought their 'A' game for this one. We fished hard and scored at least 4 fish in every session of the tournament. Only 3 teams in the entire tournament managed that feat! We finished only a few points out of the top 20 of 120 teams. Every member of our team put points on the board and only 18 teams scored more total fish than us. It was an exceptional team effort.

Both of our teams drew similar sites for the tournament. We were fishing within sight of eachother for both days. We drew sites that were generally near the edges. But it turns out that this was the tournament to get the 'middle' zone, particularly south of the point. Much of the best fishing was along the curve between the point and ramp 48. A deep cut along the turn provided some better quality fishing close to the beach. North and east winds offshore this fall had devloped a large 4 foot swell. The winds were fortunate for the anglers and rarely did it create issues.

The average angler wakes up on the morning of their first session with anticipation and excitement. There were some complications that developed overnight for all the anglers as a stalled front decided to push further west than anticipated. Heavy rains with scattered lightning was covering the island and additional storms were inbound. It was apparent that few teams were leaving as early as expected. The entire session was accompanied by rain, very heavy at times. Lightning wasn't generally visible but the consistent rumbles of thunder were a reminder of the poor conditions. Those who fished closer to buxton were hit the worse with heavy drenching rains the entire session.

We started north of the point on ramp 23 at site number 4. For those familiar with the Hatteras beaches, our site was just a few hundred yards south of the wreck always visible on the south end of Salvo. I had managed to prefish the area the day before and found a good roundhead bite. We started off by chasing some bluefish and roundhead. Many of the bluefish we caught were 6 to 10 inches but would not score any points. Most teams around us found a few roundhead averaging barely 1 point each. Our team was no different. What I thought was possibly the best beach we would fish the entire tournament turned out to be the worst for us.

The afternoon was at site number 116 near ramp 49. I received intel of a few larger bluefish in that area in the morning so we geared up and chased the bluefish bite hard in the afternoon. There were certainly a bunch of bluefish on that beach but few managed to score any points. The average was just touching that 11 inch mark. We scored 7 fish but for a meager 9 points. Barely more than 1 point per fish.

The next morning was a special area for me personally. We fished at site 66 in an area known as "South Beach". It's a south facing beach just west of the point. I spend at least half of my days in hatteras fishing in some capacity on that beach. Our site contained the wash from the larger swells and was dominating the first 80+ yards of the beach. It was impossible for most anglers to reach the calmer cleaner water. I put on a drum rig and started to sling away. Hard bites were common but hookups were rare. This was likely due to the number of smaller grey trout in the area. I managed 3 larger blues and 1 scoring grey trout for 18 points. Casting was futile for most of the other anglers in the area. A rare roundhead would enter the wash but the likelihood it would find your bait in the rip was difficult. Patty did manage a nice 13.5" roundhead to score 3 additional points for the team.

Our team ended up on Ramp 38 for the final session. A deep wide slough was available for fish to move around in. Four foot waves and some even larger were pounding the bar 200 yards out keeping most fish away from the beaches. We scavenged through small bites to eventually find a few bluefish. Robbie even caught a double header! It was our last shot to move up the leaderboard and a handful of 11 inch bluefish didn't cut it. We only managed 5 fish for 6 points.

We finished with 21 fish for 41 point. Less than 2 points per fish is an indication of just how small the average scoring fish was. We had a great time on the beach together have a lot of good memories to share.

It was a great tournament as always and there's no other place to be than peak season in Hatteras.

Team B Report:

As is frequently the case in Outer Banks Surf Tournaments, the "blitz', if you want to call it that, took place during one session and mostly for one team. The remainder of the 120 team field needed to scramble for the few fish swimming up and down the beaches of Hatteras Island. The Surfside Anglers of Kill Devil Hills beached 37 fish for 120 points in the first session of the event and held on to win the tournament with 56 fish for 160 points. Second place went to last year's winner, The Eastern Shore of Virginia Anglers Club "Fish Hoggs". They ended up with 48 fish for 109 points. New Jersey's Ocean City Fishing Club was third with 35 fish for 98 points.

Our Team #2 finished in 47th place with 11 fish worth 30 points. We produced scoring fish in all 4 sessions and every member of the team fished hard and all caught fish. Some scored; some didn't. Like most of the teams participating, we caught lots of under-sized fish and ineligible fish like sharks and rays. The team consisted of 3 ladies and 3 men. Caroline Robinson, Liz Nash and Jennie Braithwaite were the ladies and Doug Wehner, Greg Wehner and Rick Hoggard were the men. The team fished hard, worked together well and represented the Virginia Beach Anglers Club in a very commendable fashion.

Bob Bernard Individual Recap:

Our tournament team members traditionally fish the Saturday individual tournament. Our anglers have had good success competing in this tournament. You fish for a few hours on Saturday morning and have an hour to get your fish back to the clubhouse for weigh-in. Wesley Waters has been a consistent producer of quality fish in our Intra-Club tournaments this year. He was also productive on this day.


Wesley and I decided to head back to the beaches that were mostly successful during the tournament. We decided to chase two species on this day. Roundhead and Bluefish. We headed down to South Beach and Wesley picked out an area to stop at. It took a while to find a bite. He was throwing a doodle bug and got a hard hit and tough fighter! His first fish of the morning turned out to be a fat 18" bluefish pushing over 2 pounds. I had one slightly behind him at 17.75" and marked it with a zip-tie to make sure we didn't mix up our catches. We caught quite a few good blues between 16 and 18 inches but the short time frame of the tournament required us to move on to have a chance at other species.

We stopped to talk with Doug and Robbie who were fishing the same stretch. It sounded like they were having less luck than desired so we all moved around to find something different. Wesley and I went north to ramp 30 looking for a good roundhead bite. Doug would eventually head south to ramp 55. He found a few tugs but not much of any quality. Robbie headed north to check on the bite at ramp 34. There were a few good holes. He played around with a couple skates and sharks before calling it a day.

There were a few 2 pound citations along this northern stretch in the week leading up to the tournament and we wanted in on the action. Ramp 30 had a good looking beach but was very narrow. The steep beach provided some nice structure but the high tide nearly washed up to the dunes. Luckily for us it was getting close to low tide. We ran our way along the narrow tracks looking for a spot to fish. We stopped in an area with a shallow bar and a couple deep holes. I got a bluefish bite almost instantly on the puppy drum rig so I switched rigs to some fresh sandfleas on floats. The next hour seemed like the shortest one of the whole week. A couple of decent bites but we failed to make any hookups.

Our 2022 tournament schedule was now over. We held our heads high as we pulled in at the CHAC headquarters. Wesley weighed the biggest bluefish they saw all day. Congratulations to Wesley Waters for winning the Bluefish Division of the CHAC Bob Bernard Invitational!

The Nags Head Surf Fishing Club runs the annual surf fishing tournament held on their beaches. 2022 was the 70th annual tournament. As has been what seems like a tradition at this point, a big storm affected the tournament. It has been close to a decade since Nags Head was able to hold a good weather tournament and fish all their sessions on time. Numerous tournaments have been cancelled in recent years due to weather. The weekend prior to the tournament was dominated by Hurricane Ian. We got two doses of it. One when the hurricane made landfall in South Carolina. And a second time when the remnants pushed offshore of the mid Atlantic a few days later. It brought additional gusty winds and heavy surf. Our Thursday sessions were condensed into one midday session to be fished around low tide. The second day had a morning delay but we were able to fish both sessions for the full length of time. This is historically one of the better tournaments to fish. But each year is different and few anglers walked away with many scored fish in this one.

Team A Report:

As sometimes is the case, Nags Head was just coming off some higher than normal tides. As a result, the Thursday session was shortened to one four-hour, mid-day session, instead of the two three-hour sessions scheduled. The Friday schedule remained as planned. The shortened Thursday session produced lots of small fish, but our team of 6 wasn't able to put any scoring fish on the beach. We weren't alone, as 42 of the 80 teams competing scored nothing on Thursday. On Friday's morning session, the outgoing tide finally blessed us with one 15 inch bluefish. The incoming tide that afternoon gave us two 11-inch blues.

Our 7 points landed us in 47th place. Weather was great and the surf was very fishable, as evidenced by the numerous undersized speckled trout, blues, black drum and spot. There just weren't many fish of scoring size available. The winning team ended up with only 20 fish for 69 points, one of the lower scoring Nags Head events in their 70 year history. All 6 of our team members fished hard and represented the Virginia Beach Anglers Club in a sportsmanlike and competitive manner. The 3 returning anglers are Doug Wehner, Jerry Mariano and John Stout.


Hurricane Ian hit the mid Atlantic hard on the days prior to the tournament. Wind gusts over 80 mph were recorded during two separate events less than 7 days before the start of the tournament. Much of the beaches in nags head received a beach replenishment over the summer but there was little evidence of it. The weekend full moon did not help the water levels either as tides were already a foot above average.

Thursdays session we hit the beach a little north of Jennette's pier. It appeared to be a decent area to fish. As the tide went down, it was apparent that this was one of the worse spots on the beach. A small point to our north created a large wash zone with a strong rip and heavy grass. We struggled just to maintain bottom and the lines were quickly swallowed up when left in the water. Patty pulled a few roundhead out of the wash but was only able to score one of them, an impressive 13 ¾" that almost went for 4 points. We were sure that it was a terrible start to the tournament, but less than half the teams scored on the first day which kept us well up on the leaderboard.


Friday we fished some much nicer zones but had almost no bites during the morning session. It was an area with deeper water and many teams had encounters with speckled trout. No luck for us however. We moved further south in the afternoon. The trough between the beach and sandbar was about 4 feet deep, but the bar was almost dry. Many teams made the trek to walk out to the bar and fish during low tide. We encountered many more fish out there but most were small. Some teams were finding sizeable roundhead big enough to score. As the water came up, patty was able to get into a rhythm and was scoring a few small roundhead. The rest of the team was struggling to keep up but Rick was able to manage a 1 pointer before the final buzzer.

We finished in 38th place barely scraping the top half. Patty dominated the scoring with her many roundhead catches as she often does in these low scoring events. Our team had multiple misfortunes leading up to the tournament. One member had to have surgery just days before the event and was unable to participate. A second member of our team had a medical emergency within the family that withdrew them from the beach early on. We had a great time and caught some fish but wish the conditions had been a little more favorable to scoring. This is one of the best run tournaments the club participates in each year. We're looking forward to a chance at redemption next year!






