Menhaden at Risk

Tim Anderson's Menhaden article. Tim assumes office as our 83rd District Representative on January 12, 2022.

Things need to change in the Chesapeake Bay. The over-harvesting of menhaden fish is something I am going to be championing this year. We have an environmental ticking time bomb in the Chesapeake Bay and the predator ecosystem is about to collapse. This is a man made problem — the oldest one —. corporate greed and executive government inaction, especially over the past 8 years.

Virginia is the only state to allow reduction fishing on the East Coast - this type of fishing has resulted in the now imminent collapse of the menhaden fish population in the Bay. Reduction Fishing Is The Process Of Catching Huge Quantities Of Fish And Grinding Them Up For Fish Meal And Oil. The results of this over-harvesting are devastating and are leading to the rapid decline of predator fish like striped bass, bluefish and weakfish that depend on menhaden for food. Sharks, whales and birds, and yes, even sea turtles, also rely on the menhaden. The menhaden has often been called the most important fish in the sea as it is a critical link in the food chain of everything above it and feeds by straining plankton.

Why are menhaden harvested? To grind them up to sell for fish meal and oil at \$.08/pound. Cheap proteins are very important as the world population grows. These oils are used in everything from vitamin supplements, to pet food and many other products. The proteins can be reproduced in other ways like flaxseed and algae. Instead, we are destroying the ecosystem of the Bay for corporate profits because it's cheaper to suck 1000 menhaden up in a vacuum and immediately grind them up in a few minutes then it is to grow flaxseed. A few companies, who are very powerful, are right in the middle of this.

I am going to stand up and use my voice to propose common sense policies to protect this fish which is the foundation of the entire ecosystem in the Chesapeake Bay. This fish may not look like much, you likely have never heard of the menhaden fish.. but our grandchildren and future waterman should be able to enjoy the fruits of the Chesapeake Bay as we have until this point but will soon not. We protect our future by creating sustainable menhaden harvesting policies.

The menhaden fish should be harvested - they serve a purpose to mankind- just not using reduction fishing in the bay. We have to reduce harvesting in the Bay to sustainable levels. What is happening now will end in environmental disaster in my lifetime.

I intend to make very few friends in Richmond doing this - I will likely pay a huge political price for this post alone and will make some very powerful enemies before I even take office, but something about me you probably know, I thrive in confrontation.

Bottom line, it's the right thing and I have to use my loudest voice to do what needs to be done. This is not the most exciting thing to talk about - but it is one of the most important environmental issues we face in Virginia. We must get this right and we must do it now.

More to come.

Striped Bass Tagging

As a brief historical note: Since 1988 Federal fisheries agencies including the USFWS, ASMFC, NMFS, state fisheries agencies including MD, VA, and NC, and universities, have partnered to tag the mixed coastal migratory Atlantic striped bass stock on their wintering grounds off the coasts of S.E. Virginia and N.E. North Carolina. This is a required part of the ASMFC Amendment 6 to the Atlantic Striped Bass Interstate FMP, and part of a coastwide striped bass tagging program coordinated by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and participating state partners. In years past the tagging was conducted aboard a NOAA research vessel (such as the Oregon II) using trawl gear. However, in recent years funding sources have been more difficult to locate. In an effort to continue the long-term tagging data series without missing a year, the coordinating partners decided to secure recreational charter boats to collect and tag striped bass using hook and line. We have secured funding for using hook and line to accomplish the annual tagging, and there will not be a trawling portion of the tagging this year.

Initial dates for the 2022 H&L tagging trips are: January 5- January 28. We are aiming to go on 10-13 trips within this timeframe (or longer if needed). We will take trips as weather permits until we reach our target. So inevitably dates will vary depending on weather and/or fish cooperation. Each year several trips are cancelled due to weather, and it has been common for dates to extend into February, so don't be shy about signing up for later dates if you are unavailable in early January. We are beginning fishing out of Ocean City, MD. The boat will be docked at Sunset Marina, Ocean City, MD. <u>Currently we have a group</u> rate at the Comfort Suites (\$59 Sun-Th, \$69 Fri/Sa), 12718 Ocean Gateway, Ocean City, MD 21842, 410-213-7171. To get the group rate you need to mention "Fish and Wildlife." There are a few other hotels near the marina, and better rates may potentially be had on third party sites.

This email serves as the initial call for scientific crew members and anglers. Please email me your available dates that you would like to participate. Please include a cell number where you can receive texts about trip cancellations. Also, please forward this to your staff or colleagues that may be interested. We have some critical staff that need to go on each trip, so depending on the response, we may not be able to accommodate every request. However, we would like to get as much participation from as many different partners as possible. Volunteer anglers (non-government employees) are also welcome.

Day of Fishing Info:

Arrive time: Get to the marina by 6:45 am at the latest. The boat pulls away from the dock at 7:00 am. The Boat is the Midnight Sun and is docked at Sunset Marina (slip # TBD; 12911 Sunset Ave, Ocean City, MD 21842)

Food and drink: Bring your own food and drink for the day. It is a long day. If we get into the fish we often get back to the marina just before dark. Please bring your own water, etc to drink.... There is a large cooler on the boat where we can stick quite a few items. You are welcome to bring a small lunch cooler if you'd like.

Striped Bass Tagging Continued

<u>Gear:</u> Obviously it is likely to be cold so dress appropriately. We still go if its raining as well. The deck gets quite wet, so wear appropriate footwear. Tennis shoes will not cut it. We'll have some gloves that we can provide for folks BUT if you have appropriate gloves feel free to bring them. Gloves are likely the only gear we can provide.

PFDs:

o State/federal agency employees: Refer to your specific agency guidelines, The captain has all the coast guard required safety gear and life jackets, but feel free to bring a PFD if you choose or if your agency requires it.

o Volunteer anglers: No need to bring any PFDs unless you have a personal one you plan on wearing.

PICTURES OF SAMPLING AND SOCIAL MEDIA:

As most of you probably know, it is illegal to even practice targeted catch-and-release fishing for striped bass in the EEZ, much less harvest striped bass in the EEZ. The Coast Guard and other Federal law enforcement groups spend quite a bit of time and money enforcing this regulation. For the past several years the large schools of striped bass have been from 15-25 miles offshore (which is in the EEZ). A few years ago a picture of a party member holding a large striped bass was posted to someone's social media page. The picture went viral throughout the fishing community and generated a ton of interest from private boat anglers, many of whom could not resist going out there to try and catch some big fish. Needless to say we do not want to encourage this behavior. **Therefore, as a condition of allowing us to conduct this research in the EEZ, NO ONE is to post pictures or videos of us catching fish to any social media sites**. Also, do not email or share any pictures or video to someone that may post it to social media. You are more than welcome to take a few pictures, just don't let them get to the internet. We have not had this happen since that one incident and we need to keep it that way.

Trip cancellations: We can't go if the wind is much over 18-20 knots. The Captain and I look at the weather forecast every day and make every effort to make the decision about a cancellation at least the evening/night before a trip. However, it is fishing, and there is always the possibility the weather will change overnight and we all get to the dock only to find out we can't go. So please check your emails and texts continually as I send out daily updates each afternoon. If you don't have an easy way to check your email, please let me know. Sometimes the call for a fishing trip cannot get made until we get back to the dock because of cell service issues offshore.

Space: This a big boat, about 50 ft, but with all the gear/equipment we need is a lot. Please pack as efficiently as possible, especially agency staff with float coats and life jackets.

Fished with Russell Willoughby in the Elizabeth River in my boat, a Superglide V14 Bass Tracker with a new Mercury 4-strokeon it. 49-50 degree water on an outgoing tide we found about 15 specks while trolling with Salt Assassin Fire Tigers. 7 were keepers 17"-20", I released this 20 incher pictured. This was the best catch I have had in a month. Thanks Russell for helping me out with the trailer and gas issue.


Fresh Water News




