## Ocean Acidification and Coastal Fisheries

### A Look into the Future

Over the past 200 years, our ocean waters have become 30% more acidic. This rate of change is 10 times faster than during the past 50 million years.

### What is Ocean Acidification?

The ocean helps regulate Earth's climate, absorbing 30% of the carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) released when we drive our cars and power our homes. Beneath the surface, CO<sub>2</sub> reacts with water to form an acid, a process called Ocean Acidification (OA).

#### Some of the CO<sub>2</sub> combines with water to form carbonic acid. Excess hydrogen ions make the ocean more acidic.

### How does Acidification impact our local finfish and shellfish?



Oysters and Hard Clams need minerals from the ocean to build strong, healthy shells. In more acidic waters, the minerals become scarce. Weaker shells are less resistant to predation and disease. Larval shells are smaller and more irregular under high CO, conditions.

Sharks Acidic waters can corrode the denticles in some species of shorks, making their skin more prone to infection and changing how they swim through the water.



#### Summer Flounder


Fewer eggs survive to hatching in more acidic waters (high CO<sub>2</sub> conditions).

#### **Atlantic Silversides**

An important baitfish in the Mid-Atlantic, their larval stages grow more slowly in more acidic waters (high CO, conditions).

OUTLOOK Ocean Acidification, in combination with warming ocean waters and more frequent low oxygen conditions can impact the growth, reproduction, and survival of our local fish and shellfish. Together, these changing ocean conditions will likely make our local fish more vulnerable to acidication in the future.



Talk about it! Teach your friends and family about acidification and how they can help.

- Get involved in a local water quality monitoring program or habitat restoration project.
- Use less fertilizer on your lawn to reduce nutrient runoff that can lead to acidification.
- Save Electricity: Switch to LED light bulbs or Energy Star appliances.










Lou Corigliano went fishing for Spanish Mackerel recently. With his wife as the captain, he had some pretty darn good luck!



#### Pirate's Cove Billfish Tournament Celebrates 40 Years of Big Game Competition Manteo, North Carolina

June 29. 2023

Celebrating its 40th anniversary this year, the Pirate's Cove Billfish Tournament is gearing up for another memorable event as top teams throughout the Mid-Atlantic compete in the fertile waters off North Carolina's Outer Banks. The latest edition will feature a purse topping the million-dollar mark, competitive entry categories and a charity raffle to benefit the local community.

Again this year the PCBT will offer split entries on all but the Base Category for tournament boats. Non Omni Directional Sonar boats can expect to pay approximately \$15,500 across the board with an additional \$1,000 to enter the charity Lay Day Tournament. Boats that plan on deploying an Omni Directional Sonar at any time during fishing hours will enter separate categories with additional fees totaling just over \$25,000 including the charity event.

"Our Omni/Non-Omni split registration is designed to level the playing field yet still allow boats that wish to use the technology the opportunity for additional payouts. The split option has been well received by the teams," says Tournament Director Heather Maxwell. The 34<sup>th</sup> Annual Alice Kelly Memorial Ladies Only Billfish Tournament, one of the largest lady angler only competitive sport-fishing event in the world, will not allow Omni Directional Sonar to be deployed during the event. The ladies event precedes the PCBT.

"Oregon Inlet is finally perfect," Maxwell adds. "The channel is fully dredged and in great shape and there are no height clearance issues for the larger tower boats. We also have four Yeti Ice Tanks filled with fishing and hunting trips and other great prizes that we'll be raffling off to benefit our local charities."

The Alice Kelly Memorial allows pre-registration on Friday, 8/11, at the Pavilion at the Pirate's Cove Marina. Regular registration is Saturday, 8/12, followed by the festive kick-off party, with fishing on Sunday, August 13th. The Pirate's Cove Billfish Tournament starts on Monday, August 14th, with fishing slated for August 15-18, 2023. Advance registration for both tournaments is available on-line at www.pcbgt.com






