Darlin' Marlin


Fishing report by George Gabriel

July 6th, just a few days after Arthur's glancing blow: Chris Schneider arranged a jaunt aboard the Rebel hailing out of Virginia Beach in an attempt to add scientific data as to whether pelagics go back on the feed after a right hurricane. The formidable crew included Michelle, George Gabriel, and Pete Feds. The seas were calm; the skies were clearthe Rebel motored along at a comfortable pace of 30+ knots. Arriving at the desired fishing grounds in short order, the spread was established and the troll began. The decision was made to get this one boat side and keep the meat! As our captain promised, white marlin made excellent sushi, and was quite tasty on the Barbi!!!






