ROCKFISH RODEO RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The deadline for registration is **Friday, November 27, 2015 @ 7:00P.M.**
- 2. The Virginia Beach Angler's Club reserves the right to refuse entry to any angler or vessel.
- 3. The entry fee is \$100.00 per boat if paid on or before November 20, 2015. Thereafter, the fee is \$125.00.
- 4. The Tournament Committee advises all participants to attend the Captains Meeting to insure they are aware of any rule changes or clarifications prior to the start of the tournament.
- 5. At the Captains Meeting, the Tournament Committee will decide if Saturday is fishable. If Saturday is declared not fishable, the tournament will be rescheduled for Sunday.
- 6. Each boat entered in the tournament will be eligible for only one prize.
- 7. The Tournament Committee has the right to inspect all vessels entered in the competition.
- 8. A vessel may not be replaced after the entry deadline, unless broken down. A tournament official must be notified of the change prior to "lines in".
- 9. "Lines in" is no earlier than the completion of the Captains Meeting on November 27th, 2015.
- 10. Any boat entered in the tournament must leave and return to a Virginia port while fishing the tournament.
- 10. All fish must be caught on hook and line.
- 11. Fish shall not be mutilated in any way.
- 12. Two or more vessels congregating close enough to pass fish may be disqualified from the tournament.
- 13. **Scales will be open from 3:00P.M. to 4:00P.M.** All fish will be weighed by the official VBAC Tournament Weighmaster in order to qualify for the tournament.
- 14. All fish must be weighed in at the Tournament Headquarters not later than 4:00P.M.
- 15. Fish will be checked for freshness and are subject to inspection of stomach contents.
- 16. All protests must be submitted no later than 30 minutes after the conclusion of the weigh in.
- 17. Prizes will be awarded at 6:30P.M. on Saturday, November 28th, 2015 at Murphy's Irish Pub located at 30th and Pacific Avenue, Virginia Beach, Virginia.
- 18. Prizes are awarded solely on the basis of fish weight. In the event of identical weights, the first fish weighed in will be declared the winner.
- 19. A vessel registrant must be present and positive identification is required for all prizes.
- 20. Winning anglers may be requested to submit to a polygraph test prior to being presented any prize.
- 21. All fish weighed in the tournament must abide by all rules and regulations established by the Virginia Marine Resource Commission in relation to Striped Bass. This includes but is not limited to: size restrictions, bag limits and the territorial designation of the water to which the fish was caught.

The following statement must be read, signed and turned in with the entry form

I understand that, as tournament captain, participant, or boat owner, I am responsible for my boat and occupants at all times. I have read and fully understand and agree to abide by all rules of the Virginia Beach Angler's Club Rockfish Rodeo. I hereby release the Virginia Beach Angler's Club, Rockfish Rodeo, Long Bay Pointe Marina, Murphy's Irish Pub, and all their affiliates from any and all liability. I further understand that the decision to fish and participate in the Rockfish Rodeo is the responsibility of the registrant, captain, or boat owner.







The Virginia Game Fish Tagging Program still has some spaces left for 2016!

The Virginia Game Fish Tagging Program is looking for a few good fisherman...

Are you an avid angler? Would you like to learn what happens to the fish you release?

For more than 20 years, our team of dedicated taggers have been tagging fish and contributing data to help us learn more about our favorite game fish species. A cooperative effort between the Marine Advisory Services Program at VIMS and the Saltwater Tournament Program at the Virginia Marine Resources Commission, the VGFTP was created in 1995 with the overall goal of training and maintaining an experienced group of recreational anglers who volunteer their time and effort to tag

Speckled Trout Acoustic Tagging Program at VIMS

The Virginia Institute of Marine Science (VIMS) has started a new acoustic tagging program to catch, release, and track speckled trout as they migrate through the tidewater region. Previous uses of this acoustic device include the use of acoustic tags to track sharks and sturgeon. The information gained by the use of these tags has been greater than by many other methods of tracking species of migrating fish. As more information about this program becomes available, it will be shared with the angler's club. We may also have Pat McGrath out to speak more about the efforts they hope to achieve with this new acoustic tagging program.


Fishing Reports

Double Daily Limit – by Ike Eisenhower

Went fishing 11-16-15 on my boat the ShelbyKat II looking for tautog with Russell Willoughby. Beautiful day, light West winds, right at the turn of current from ebb to flood. First went to the Cape Henry wreck and despite repositioning several times, only caught togs too small to keep and toads. Russell did hook one that had to be huge but cut his tackle when the tog went into a hole. When the current started to rip so we went to the 3rd Island tube. No luck there. As the current started to diminish, we went over to the 2nd. As the current slacked, it was game on. We began hooking 16-18 inch fish interspersed with 14-15 inch fish catching one after another. Usually involving getting our bait stolen before hooking up. We both found that using a 1/0 treble hook worked best to get them to the boat. The bite actually picked up when the current started moving. We got out limit of keeper fish about two hours of fishing and then began to throw 17 inch fish back until we used up all our blue crabs. Over all I'm sure we threw back at least a dozen togs too short to keep. Several were right at 15 inch and fat. Next year that should be just right. I haven't had a tautog fishing day like this in years. I hope that the weather will allow me to try again soon.



Striper Season Coronation; version 2015 – by Kelly Hoggard

Went out striper fishing on Wednesday, November 25th with Jerry Hughes. Got an unexpected call from him late Tuesday that he heard I wanted to go fishing. We loaded up the equipment Wednesday morning and made our way out onto the water. The water was fairly calm and we motored straight towards Cape Charles. We set up near the texaco wreck but the east wind and incoming tide pushed us into shallow water on the west side. Much more bait was along the cut on the east side, so we slid on over. Reports of fish were coming in on the radio so we knew there was a chance to bring one home. Made multiple drifts with 8 eels in the water on both sides of the texaco. Went north about 2 miles of Cape Charles and found some great marks, but the water was dirty and again, no bites. Took a run south near the end of the deep cut near the concrete ships. Again, had great marks between 35 and 60 feet of water but not even a knockdown the entire day. Pulled in the rods just after sunset. Around 5:30, got to the baltimore channel and the boat gives a warning light. Overheating. Tore out some parts while we were rocking in a 10-15mph east wind. Found a ring in the impellar assembly that was completely wore out and leaking water into the boat. Water intake pipes were sucking air during operation. Ed Schrader with Sea Tow came around to give me a 2 hour tow back to vinnings in little creek. 14 hours on the boat today. Expect the problem to be fixed relatively easy. Best bite was on last of the incoming around 8-10 in the morning. Know of one fish caught north of
