Surf Fishing Information – By Robbie Parks

The new year is here and time to be thinking about this year's surf fishing tournaments. They are a lot of fun to fish and a great time to hang out with fellow club members. A lot of the guys that fish these tournaments have years of surf fishing experience and are willing to share their knowledge with each other and any new guys. We want everyone to do well so the team does well.

I want to explain a little of how our club selects surf fishing teams for these tournaments. First of all, your dues for the current year must be paid and you must have participated in at least one event to help out the club in the previous year to be eligible to be on a team. The tournaments we participate in all have six man teams. We fill our teams by the three high scorers from last year's team getting to come back on this year's team and drawing three names from the pot to fill the other three positions. This gives us at least three experienced members on each team and gives everyone in the club a chance to put their name in the pot to be drawn.

We participate in five tournaments during the year. Ocracoke in the spring and Hatteras Village, Long Beach Island, Nags Head and Cape Hatteras Angler's Club in the fall. We field two teams in Hatteras Village and Long Beach Island. Only one team in the other three. The expenses for team members involve participation fees, lodging, meals, travel, and bait. Team members pay a \$20 participation fee to help offset the entry fee paid by the club except for the Long Beach Island tournament. Lodging cost from \$90 to \$160. Travel and meals is approximately \$100. Each team member gets his own bait \$25. For the Hatteras Village and Nags Head tournaments this run in the \$275 to \$300 range. Each team member fixes one meal for the whole team \$35 to \$40. For Ocracoke, and Cape Hatteras Angler's Club in the \$325 to \$375 range. The higher expenses for these two are primarily due to higher lodging costs. The Long Beach Island tournament also cost in the \$325 to \$375 range due to higher lodging and travel expenses. These figures are a general rule and could be higher or lower than stated. You will also have to have the proper fishing licenses (NC nonresident saltwater annual license \$30) and permits to drive on the beaches (\$120 annual, \$50 seven day). New Jersey also requires you register as a saltwater fisherman to fish there at no cost (done on line).

The Ocracocke Tournament will be held on April 30 and May 1, 2015. The drawing for team members will be at the February meeting. All the other tournaments are held in the fall and the drawing for them will be at the March meeting. For the Ocracoke tournament the \$20 participation fee and \$40 lodging deposit (\$60 total) are due at the March meeting with the balance of the Lodging due at the April meeting. The \$20 participation fee and \$40 lodging deposit (\$60 total) for each team you are on is due at the April meeting with the balance due at the meeting the month before the tournament.

If you have any questions about the surf fishing tournaments just catch me at a meeting and I will be happy to answer them if I can.

Acoustic Tagging Program

The Virginia Beach Anglers Club received an email regarding an acoustic tagging program that is currently in need of support. Patrick McGrath from the Virginia Institute of Marine Science (VIMS) asked that we help spread the word of the new program trying to gain a foothold in our area. Acoustic tagging programs are common with larger fish like shark. VIMS is attempting to use the same kind of program and data to analyze Speckled Trout marine ecology. As members of the fishing community, it is important that we help do our part to support these types of programs. There were some materials forwarded to us by members of both VIMS and the Recreational Fishing Advisory Board (RFAB). A few copies will be provided at this month's meeting.

Acoustic Tagging at VIMS – VIA PAT McGRATH

Hello, please allow me to introduce myself, I am Pat McGrath (patm@vims.edu; feel free to contact me if you have any questions regarding this article) and I currently work with acoustically tagging fishes at the Virginia Institute of Marine Science. Acoustic tags are different than the conventional tags because they emit a signal approximately every minute which includes a unique identifying number. When these tags are implanted into fish, we can they follow their movements for the lifespan of the tag (anywhere from 1 to 10 years). Some tags also include sensors that will tell the swimming depth, surrounding water temperature, or swimming speed. The signals from these tags are picked up by either onboard hydrophones or acoustic receivers. There are over 100 receivers listening for tagged fish within Chesapeake Bay and most major estuaries from Maine to Florida have a receiver array in place.

Currently, we are in year two of acoustically tagging Atlantic sturgeon. VIMS has partnered with VCU, CBL, VDGIF, and MdDNR to tag both adult (4-10 ft) and sub-adult (1-4 ft) fish. In 2014, VIMS tagged 9 adults in the Pamunkey River (largest was an 8 ft, 220 lb female) and 47 sub-adults in the James and York Rivers. Several sub-adults that were tagged in the James River during the spring were detected off Long Island several months later. We currently have a proposal (Temperature selectivity and movement patterns of spotted seatrout) under consideration by the Recreational Fishing and Advisory Board (RFAB) to use acoustic tags with temperature sensors to better understand the behavior associated with speckled trout winter mortality events and the general movement patterns through-out the year. As most of you remember from last winter, thousands of speckled trout died in a cold stun event brought on by near freezing water temperatures. We would like to tag fish in the Corrotoman River and the Elizabeth River to understand the behavior associated with these cold winter temperatures. Do the fish attempt to move away from the cold water, but get overrun by sudden drops in temperature or do fish try to find a deep hole and hope for the best? The information that we will gather will give scientists and managers information concerning seasonal movements, temperature selectivity, and stock identification. More importantly to the recreational angler, the data will produce maps for anglers indicating hot spots for speckled trout and preferred water temperatures. The public comment period for this proposal is currently open and if you would like to voice your opinion for this project, please write to Alicia Nelson at the VMRC (alicia.nelson@mrc.virginia.gov).




