



Coast Guard Vessel Safety Inspections

Coast Guard vessel safety inspections are available to the public for free. The process is very simple and they meet you anywhere that is convenient for you. They will meet you at a house, boat ramp, or marina.. Wherever your boat is stored.

You will be redirected to the webpage:

Fill in the form provided and submit, and a Vessel Examiner nearest to your zip-code will call you or email you to set up a vessel exam in your driveway, at a boat ramp, or in a marina, wherever you have your boat. It does not need to be in the water to be examined.

Fishing Regulations

Now is a great time to remember to check the new regulations for the 2015 season. Regulations can be changed at almost any time deemed necessary. It is best to familiarize yourself with the current regulations during the spring and summer seasons. It is not uncommon to go fishing this time of year and end up catching fish that you didn't expect to find in your favorite spots. These apps allow access to a number of different interactive services. The VMRC app provides things like Recreational fishing regulations and Saltwater Journal Entry System. The Coast Guard app gives you access to boater safety information.

Memorial Day Cobia Trip – by George Gabriel

Payoff for my VBAC membership

Over the holiday weekend I started to receive messages from fellow VBAC members, telling me the cobia bite was on. By the time I prepared to get involved in the action (Monday, Memorial Day) I had the relevant intel informing me where to fish, what bait to use, and a fairly accurate assessment of what my catch would be. Leaving nothing to chance- I set out with a crew that included a member of the Ecumenical Council (my parish priest) together with Bob Stuhlman and Chris Schneider. Placing faith in my fellow club member's intel we headed out to Buoy 13 loaded up with sea clam, fresh crabs, fresh bunker, and other assorted baits. Selecting a promising spot, we anchored the boat and proceeded to deploy a potpourri of baits into the water; and despite Mariano not being on the boat- lines zipped soon after the bunker hit the water. After some time two hungry cobia hit our clam baits within 15 minutes of one another.



While others had the fortune to get some large sheepshead to mix in with their bite- we were able to entice sharks and these 2 friends.

We were entertained by some very funny antics by certain crew members. In one instance, we all jumped to action as Chris Schneider leaped to deal with a rod that suddenly screamed. Chris quickly found himself engaged in battle with a head shaking, determined foe. Beginning to believe the fight would be protracted (the fish wouldn't budge off the bottom) this experienced angler called for the fighting belt! Not soon after clearing the other 6 rods, the concerned crew debated whether to pull anchor to help with the battle. The decision made, the captain manned the helm, while Bob S began to retrieve our hook. As one might predict, with the boat moving- so was the fish- the rod was alive! Adding urgency to the retrieval of the anchor Bob man handled the well placed submerged fluked steel, while angler Chris began to make significant headway. Miraculously both fluked steel anchor and curved steel hook hit the surface at the same time. It appeared this crafty fish slipped Chris's hook and wrapped it onto the anchor. A hardy laugh was had by most of the crew... The anchor would prove to be a true foe to Chris that day- as the winds suddenly began to whip up, we planned our last spread of baits when a large fish hit one of our lines. I say large, because after setting the hook and the drag, the fish continued to rip line- heading towards the surface and as far away from the boat as possible. Looking for redemption, Chris took over the battle, this time confident that something alive was on the end of his line. This determined fish took Chris in all possible directions, the last of which was right to the anchor line. You guessed it- fish on; now fish off. No worries, we'll be back to get the bas----d!

Two Boats: One Fishing Trip - May 24th – by Kelly Hoggard

<u>Mistaken</u>

A disastrous end to last Decembers Striper season took much longer to get the boat going this year than expected. After significant man hours and having mechanics volunteer their services, the boat was ready to go.

2am: Normally men my age are rolling into bed around this time on a Sunday morning. I was still up after many hours of fishing gear maintenance and prep to get the best of the next day's fishing experience. A few minutes later, and the car was loaded for an early morning drum trip. All goes smooth until the alarm goes off right before leaving dock. The engine is overheating. The decision is made to clear all the gear and make a trip on another crewman's boat.

4am: With one crewman left behind to catch up on his sleep, the two anglers left make a run for the marina. Jon Calhoun and myself make the trip to Lynnhaven Boat Ramp and launch the boat.



6am: Lines are finally in the water. A still south east breeze blows at 10-15mph and kicks a small chop. The sea is dead. Crab, clam, crab and clam, half crabs.. It didn't matter, not a hit for two hours. We even began nodding off as the waves were like sitting in a rocking chair.

8am: And then it starts! A couple of nibbles and it happens: The line all the way to the left immediately runs over to the right side of the boat and fish on! The fish comes right out of the water about thirty feet from the boat and shakes his head making three consecutive jumps. "Oh my goodness! What kind of shark comes straight to the surface and jumps out of the water?!" The cobia kind it turns out. A short hour later and three fish are on the boat. Two cobia and one Sheepshead. Though one boat was down, spirits were high as there were fish to bring home for the grill. The drum trip yields no sign of any drum. Sometimes it is nice to be a little lucky!
