
Catch a Ride


Seton Youth Fishing Day - June 27th



Coast Guard vessel safety inspections are available to the public for free. The process is very simple and they meet you anywhere that is convenient for you. They will meet you at a house, boat ramp, or marina.. Wherever your boat is stored.

Fill in the form provided and submit, and a Vessel Examiner nearest to your zip-code will call you or email you to set up a vessel exam in your driveway, at a boat ramp, or in a marina, wherever you have your boat. It does not need to be in the water to be examined.

Coastal Regulations:

Apply in Virginia's coastal ocean waters inside the Three Mile Limit Line, plus all of the creeks, bays, inlets and tributaries on the seaside of Accomack County, Northampton County (including areas east of the causeway from Fisherman Island to the maintand) and the City of Virginia Beach (including federal areas and state parks, fronting on the Atlantic Ocean and east and south of the point where the shoreward boundary of the Territorial Sea joins the mainland at Cape Henry).

Striped Bass Regulations for Spring 2015

Here is a list of some things to keep in mind when Striper fishing this spring:

Size Limits – Posted on the left and <u>available here.</u>

Permit Requirement – New for 2015 is a permit that recreational anglers are required to hold in order to fish and keep striped bass this spring. The permit is free and more information is available here.

Reporting Requirement – it is your responsibility to report all trophy-size (36 inches total length or greater) striped bass caught or released during the 2015 spring trophy-size striped bass recreational season. The electric version of the VA Saltwater Journal can be used as a form of compliance to this requirement. The other is by using a mail-in form provided by going to this Mailing Form Link.






