Our Team A (*Carl McCoy, Jerry Hughes, James Yandle, Steve Wray, Stan Sutliff,* and *Robbie Parks*) finished in 10th place with 8 fish and 35 points. Our Team B (*Butch Eason, Melanie Bayford, Cheryl Johnson, Larry Regula, Andy Spencer,* and *Jim Wisenberg*) finished in 14th place with 16 fish and 29 points. The first place team had 75 points, second place: 66 points, and third place: 58 points.






